RESPONSE OF PUBLIC COUNSEL TO COMMISSION STAFF'S PETITION TO INITIATE JOINT INVESTIGATION

- Pursuant to WAC 480-07-370(4), Public Counsel submits this response to the Petition to
 Initiate Joint Investigation, filed by the Staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
 Commission ("Commission").
 - Staff requests the Commission to initiate a joint investigation into the coal supply agreement for Colstrip Units 3 and 4 entered into by Avista Utilities ("Avista"), Puget Sound Energy ("PSE"), and Pacific Power and Light Company ("PacifiCorp") ("Colstrip Owners"). Staff seeks to investigate the prudency of the increased costs associated with the coal supply agreement and the allocation of costs and benefits associated with a plan to apply combustion additives to coal burned at Units 3 and 4 in order to qualify for a Production Tax Credit. Staff states that the issues are common to all of the Colstrip Owners and asserts that a joint investigation would promote judicial economy, resolve confidentiality concerns, and enable the Commission to obtain the necessary information on the issues.

3. Public Counsel agrees with Staff that the questions raised regarding the coal supply

contracts must be investigated and shares Staff's concerns over judicial economy and

confidentiality. Attempting to address these issues in three separate dockets will needlessly

require triplication of time and effort for parties and the Commission and will significantly

complicate the handling of confidential information. As evidenced by the experience in Docket

UE-190882, a joint investigation would be the most efficient and effective way to conduct an

investigation into issues shared by multiple utilities. Public Counsel, therefore, supports Staff's

petition to initiate a joint investigation of the Colstrip coal supply contracts.
