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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 JUDGE CAILLE: Good morning. We are convened
- 3 in a hearing room in Olympia, Washington, for a status
- 4 conference in Docket Number TV-050537, captioned, In
- 5 the Matter of the Penalty Assessment Against All My
- 6 Sons Moving and Storage of Seattle, Inc.
- 7 Today is March 21st, 2006, and it's
- 8 approximately ten o'clock. First of all, let me take
- 9 appearances. I know we have a new AG appearing in this
- 10 case. We should get her appearance, so if you will
- 11 please state your name, whom you represent, your
- 12 mailing address, e-mail address, telephone and fax
- 13 numbers, and let's begin with Staff.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: This is Jennifer
- 15 Cameron-Rulkowski, C-a-m-e-r-o-n, hyphen,
- 16 R-u-l-k-o-w-s-k-i, on behalf of Commission staff. The
- 17 address is 1400 South Evergreen Park Drive Southwest,
- 18 PO Box 40128, Olympia, Washington, 98504. Telephone is
- 19 (360) 664-1186. Fax is (360) 586-5522. E-mail is
- 20 jcameron@wutc.wa.gov.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you very much.
- 22 Mr. Haffner, you can just state your name and whom you
- 23 represent. We have all the other information from your
- 24 previous appearance.
- 25 MR. HAFFNER: This is Greq Haffner, and I'm

- 1 the attorney for All My Sons Moving and Storage of
- 2 Seattle, Inc., and all of my previous contact
- 3 information remains the same.
- 4 JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you. Let the record
- 5 reflect there are no other appearances. On the
- 6 schedule, we had designated today as a teleconference
- 7 status hearing I think principally to see how the
- 8 parties were doing as far as any possibilities of
- 9 settlement, and I heard from Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski
- 10 yesterday that the parties have agreed to or are
- 11 proposing a schedule in order to accommodate further
- 12 settlement discussions; is that correct?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: That's correct.
- MR. HAFFNER: That's correct.
- 15 JUDGE CAILLE: Would one of you like to carry
- on from here and set forth your proposal?
- 17 MR. HAFFNER: Do you want to take that,
- 18 Jennifer, since it was your schedule?
- 19 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I would except my
- 20 computer screen just went down, so if you would do it,
- 21 please.
- MR. HAFFNER: Your Honor, we would propose to
- 23 change the evidentiary hearing from June 5 through the
- 9 to the week of July 10 through the 14.
- 25 JUDGE CAILLE: Was that the only change to

- 1 the schedule?
- 2 MR. HAFFNER: No. We have some corresponding
- 3 changes, and I wanted to confirm that those dates work
- 4 for you as a hearing date before we backed up the other
- 5 dates.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Let me check.
- 7 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, I know
- 8 you mentioned you had an appointment on July 12 in the
- 9 afternoon?
- JUDGE CAILLE: Yes. Were we thinking we
- 11 would need the entire week?
- 12 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I wouldn't suspect
- 13 that we would.
- 14 JUDGE CAILLE: We could schedule the entire
- 15 week, and maybe that Wednesday could be -- maybe we
- 16 will finish in two days, or maybe you folks will settle
- 17 and we will have a settlement conference instead, and
- 18 that will be very quick, but to make sure that we have
- 19 something lined up, let me just check the
- 20 commissioners' calendar too to make sure there is room
- 21 available. That looks just fine, so let's go with
- 22 that, and then backing it up...
- MR. HAFFNER: If I go backwards on the
- 24 current schedule, the next item closest to the
- 25 evidentiary hearing would be the Staff filing of

- 1 rebuttal testimony. Jennifer, you had given me June
- 2 15, but that's a Thursday. June 16 is the Friday.
- 3 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: For me, filing on
- 4 Thursday is more convenient than Friday, so I simply
- 5 put it since it will be Staff filing to be on a
- 6 Thursday.
- 7 MR. HAFFNER: I don't have any problem with
- 8 that being filed on the 15th. The next date would you
- 9 the Company files response testimony, and that would be
- 10 Friday, May 19. The next date would be Staff files
- 11 testimony, and that would be April 20, a Thursday, and
- 12 then I had a question about whether we would want to
- 13 have another teleconference status hearing on Tuesday,
- 14 April 18. I think it would make sense to have one.
- 15 JUDGE CAILLE: Okay. Now, what time on April
- 16 18th, Tuesday? I have a dental appointment at 8:30, so
- if it could be -- 10:30 would be for sure I would be
- 18 ready.
- 19 MR. HAFFNER: I could do 10:30 or eleven.
- JUDGE CAILLE: Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski?
- 21 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Whatever would be
- 22 convenient for everyone. My day will be open. I have
- 23 a hearing on that day that's being moved.
- 24 JUDGE CAILLE: Let's make it eleven o'clock,
- 25 and that will be just a teleconference, and I won't

- 1 require a court reporter unless somebody advises me
- 2 ahead of time, okay?
- 3 MR. HAFFNER: That's fine.
- 4 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: That's fine.
- 5 JUDGE CAILLE: I think that schedule will
- 6 work just fine. I'll just inquire, do the parties seem
- 7 like they are moving towards reaching an agreement on
- 8 the issues in this case?
- 9 MR. HAFFNER: I believe we are, Your Honor.
- 10 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I believe that also.
- 11 It's simply a matter of the time it takes to go back
- 12 and forth.
- MR. HAFFNER: I would have one other request,
- 14 and since we are moving the hearing date out that we
- 15 also extend the discovery period to allow until April
- 16 14.
- 17 JUDGE CAILLE: Do you have any objection to
- 18 that?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: No, I do not.
- 20 MR. HAFFNER: Just so Your Honor knows, we
- 21 have not engaged in any formal discovery yet. We have
- 22 been focused on settlement negotiations, and they have
- 23 been very productive so far.
- JUDGE CAILLE: That's good to hear. We
- 25 always encourage that. Is there anything more to be

1 discussed today? MR. HAFFNER: Not from the Company. MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: No, Your Honor. JUDGE CAILLE: Thank you very much, and good luck on your negotiations. (Prehearing conference adjourned at 10:13 a.m.)
