### **MEMORANDUM**

- 1 NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed a complaint in this docket, Docket UT-063038, against nine competitive local exchange carriers or CLECs, alleging that the companies' use of virtual NXX or VNXX numbering arrangements violates Qwest's access tariffs, prescribed exchange areas and state law, and is contrary to public policy.
- 2 PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND: The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington, July 19, 2006, before Administrative Law Judge Ann E. Rendahl. In Order 01, Prehearing Conference Order, the Commission established a procedural schedule.

- 3 **MOTION:** On October 13, 2006, Qwest filed a request for an extension of time to file initial testimony for three weeks and extend all other dates in the procedural schedule by three weeks. Qwest reported that no other party objected to the proposal, and that it has not confirmed that all parties support the proposal.
- 4 **COMMISSION DECISION:** The Commission issued a notice providing all parties an opportunity to respond to an alternative proposal which extends the prefiled testimony filing dates by three weeks and extends the hearing dates out six weeks. No party filed comments objecting to the alternative schedule. Qwest's proposed procedural schedule modified by the notice is reasonable and should be adopted. The revised procedural schedule is attached to this Order as Appendix A.
- 5 PREHEARING CONFERENCE: A prehearing conference to discuss the status of the proceeding is scheduled to begin on December 6, 2006, beginning at 9:30 a.m., in Room 206, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S.
