ZILLAH, Wash. — A 55-year-old Zillah woman was

killed Sunday evening when her car rolled after striking a tractor on the Yakima Valley Highway, according to the Washington State Patrol.

Vickie A. Goodno was driving east at high speed about 2 miles east of Zillah when the accident occurred about 6:50 p.m., the State Patrol said in a news release.

Goodno's 2003 Mazda Protege struck a John Deere 4120 tractor then rolled, the patrol said.

Goodno was not wearing a seat belt and died at the scene, the patrol said.

The tractor's driver, Ralph T. Vandermeuelen, 46, of Zillah, was not hurt, the patrol said.

The cause of the accident remains under investigation, the patrol said.

Car vs. Farm Equipment Accident
