- Electric Lightwave, LLC., (ELI) on May 31, 2006, filed with the Washington State Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition for enforcement of interconnection agreement with Qwest Corporation (Qwest). The petition states that Qwest breached the terms of the parties' interconnection agreement by withholding payments for reciprocal compensation to ELI claiming that reciprocal compensation was not due to ELI on traffic that Qwest deemed to be "Virtual NXX" (VNXX) traffic. A more detailed account of the dispute is stated in the petition, which is available for inspection at the Commission's office located at Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at www.wutc.wa.gov/063040.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of telecommunications companies providing service within the state of Washington. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapters 80.01 RCW, 80.04 RCW, 80.36 RCW, 480-07 WAC, and 480-120 WAC, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04.020, and RCW 80.36.610.
