Mr. White. I am responding to your June 24, 2011 email to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission. In your email, you questioned the temporary authority the Commission granted to Arays Moving Service, LLC. on June 21, 2011 under docket TV-110407.

Before I respond to your concerns, I'd like to address the last statement in your email. You indicated you had questioned another temporary permit we issued to Parkers Moving Systems (TV-110612) in May 2011 but had not received a response. I apologize that you did not receive a response. It appears a simple clerical error occurred and your email address was entered incorrectly when responding. I am attaching that email so you can see what the response to that protest was and so you can see that it was sent to dennis.white@att.net by mistake. Again, sorry that you did not receive the original response.

Regarding the concerns raised in your May 9 letter regarding Arays Moving Service LLC. The Commission may not deny entry to a company that demonstrates that they are fit, willing and able to provide the service. The issues you raised regarding local zoning requirements are outside of our review. The commission does not have authority over local government requirements. There is no statute or rule that prescribes requirements for the business premises of intrastate household goods moving companies; or, that precludes a home-based business.

My understanding is that all companies obtaining a state business license are advised by the state Department of Licensing to check into and comply with all state, federal and local government requirements for their business.

Regarding the foreclosure issue you raised. Again, that is outside our review criteria. It is not our business to determine or know about future buyers of the property and their intentions.
