JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. We are on the record.
Good morning. Today is Wednesday, August 21st, 2019, and the time is 9:08 a.m. My name is Laura Chartoff, I'm an administrative law judge with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission.

This is Docket TG-190490, Paulino Jose Gonzalez and Veronica Luna, doing business as Universal Moving.

So, before we went on the record, I was advised by Staff that Mr. Gonzalez was unable to appear, that Veronica Luna is here, but she has difficulty understanding English and needs a translator.

Does Staff have a recommendation on this?
MS. MCPHERSON: In discussion with Mr. Gonzalez, he had stated that he had planned -- and I just spoke with Ms. Luna, and she concurred that they plan to contest the violations.

Considering the necessity of a translator and the intended request to contest the violations, I would recommend that it be postponed, and prepare for a translator and hearing at the next date.

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JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And I agree that it makes sense to postpone this because I'm not comfortable moving forward without a translator.

I'm wondering, does Ms. Luna -- would she be willing to -- can you -- is Ms. Luna present?

Can you come forward. I just want to ask you...
Oh, that. So if you understand, I just want to pick a hearing date, and I'll either -- I have some dates available. Do --

MS. LUNA: Can I say something?
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Mm-hmm.
MS. LUNA: My husband is about 15 minutes away from here. He said he is almost get here. Is that okay if we can wait or -- because he was trying to do it by himself. His English is not perfect, but he was trying to do it. I don't know if there is a possibility to wait another ten minutes maybe today.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: So you believe he is on his
way --
MS. LUNA: Yeah.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- and he will be here in about ten minutes.

MS. LUNA: Mm-hmm.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Is it your understanding that he wants to contest the violations?

MS. LUNA: Yeah, because he is the one that do the job. He is using -- my name is in the business license, just because $I$ have some of the things, but I don't really know what he is doing because $I$ am not participating doing the labor. So he is the one that can tell what he was really doing. And he also advertise his business.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Is Staff okay with recess for ten minutes to see if he appears?

MS. MCPHERSON: Ten minutes. I mean, I'm fine to recess at any time, barring the schedule of the hearing room, and $I$ think we are clear for the day.

But I thought you -- did you say 50 minutes?
MS. LUNA: In about ten, 15 minutes.
MS. MCPHERSON: Ten, 15 minutes. Okay. I misunderstood.

I am fine with that. I do have hesitation, considering the nature of what's going to be discussed, that if we also need an interpreter anyway to postpone.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yeah, okay.
Since Mr. Gonzalez is planning on contesting the violations anyway, what we do in that case is we set another hearing where we actually get into the substance of the matter, whether you're -- you know, the company is operating as a solid waste collection company. So I'm

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1 going to go ahead and set another hearing to discuss
2 that. I don't know if he needs to be present for that.
3 We can go ahead and just select a date where we're going
4 to continue this proceeding, and at that time, we will
5 have an interpreter and we can go ahead and you can
6 present your case --
7 MS. LUNA: Okay.

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JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- as to why the company is not subject to regulation of the Commission.

So I have a couple of dates picked out. It doesn't look like you have a datebook in front of you. I'm looking at October lst -- basically, sometime in the first week of October.

Do you know -- judging from the look on your face, I'm guessing you don't know your's and Mr. Gonzalez's availability?

MS. LUNA: Yeah, we still don't know, but we have plenty of time to get permission from work. Because I did it, but my husband couldn't make it today.

And all the dates that you have, is that in the morning or --

JUDGE CHARTOFF: I could do the morning or the afternoon.

MS. LUNA: Because we prefer afternoon.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I'm going to suggest,

1 is there -- would any day of the week be better than any 2 other? Other, Monday --

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JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
Is there anything else we need to discuss today?
MS. MCPHERSON: No, Your Honor.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Ms. Luna, do you have any questions?

MS. LUNA: (No audible response).
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thank you.
Okay. So we are adjourned. Thank you for coming today.

MS. MCPHERSON: Thank you, Your Honor.
(Adjourned at 9:18 a.m.)
