TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On April 5, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) filed with the Code Reviser a Preproposal Statement of Inquiry (CR-101) to promulgate new rules to implement certain sections of the Clean Energy Transformation Act (CETA)¹ centered on the implementation of Chapter 19.405 RCW. The Commission filed the CR-101 under Docket UE-210183.

On May 3, 2021, the Commission issued a Notice of Opportunity to file written comments on the treatment of energy storage and published the CR-101 for this rulemaking with responses due on Wednesday, June 2, 2021.²

On May 17, 2021, the Commission issued a Notice of Opportunity to file written comments on the interpretation of RCW 19.405.040(1)(a) related to the specification, verification, and reporting requirements for retail load met with market purchases for the purposes of compliance with RCW 19.405.030 - 19.405.050 and requested comments on how to implement the prohibition on double counting of nonpower attributes under RCW 19.405.040(1) that could occur under other programs.
