**NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND TO LATE-FILED
PETITION TO INTERVENE

TO ALL PARTIES:

On December 22, 2020, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission), on its own motion, and through its staff (Staff) issued a complaint against CenturyLink Communications, LLC, (CenturyLink or Company) in Docket UT-181051 regarding interruptions in 911 service on December 27, 2018. The Commission convened a prehearing conference on February 9, 2021, and on February 24, entered Order 01, Prehearing Conference Order; Notice of Hearing (Order 01).

On July 9, 2021, CenturyLink filed a Motion for Third-Party Discovery, requesting that the Commission issue subpoenas to TeleCommunication Systems, Inc. d/b/a Comtech Telecommunications Corp. (TSYS) and Transaction Network Services, Inc. per WAC 480-07-400(2)(a).

On July 20, 2021, TSYS filed a Motion for Intervention (Motion to Intervene), stating that CenturyLink's Motion for Third-Party Discovery shows that its participation as a party in the proceeding is appropriate.

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-355(2), the Commission may establish a time for parties to respond to petitions to intervene. Accordingly, parties may file a written response to the Motion by Friday, July 30, 2021.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That parties may file a written response to TSYS's Motion to Intervene by 5 p.m., Friday, July 30, 2021.
