REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF WIRELINE TO WIRELESS NUMBER PORTABILITY **OBLIGATIONS** 

COMES NOW, Inland Telephone Company ("Company"), by and through its attorney of record, Richard A. Finnigan, attorney at law, and files this Request for Extension of Temporary Suspension of Wireline to Wireless Number Portability Obligations (the "Request") with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (the "Commission").

## REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TEMPORARY SUSPENSION

1. Pursuant to Section 251(f)(2) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act") and the Commission's January 28, 2004 Order No. 01 in this proceeding, the Company hereby respectfully requests that the Commission extend the temporary suspension of the Company's

individual obligations to provide number portability, as that term is defined by applicable law, to requesting Commercial Mobile Radio Service ("CMRS") providers. The Company was previously granted a suspension by the Commission's Order No. 01 in this proceeding.

As described below, the original schedule was extended by the Commission's Order No. 02 in this proceeding. The subsequent deadline for the first conversion is December 31, 2004.

- 2. In issuing Order No. 01, the Commission found that the Company's Petition provided an adequate basis for temporarily suspending the Company's obligations to comply with federal number portability requirements.<sup>2</sup> Among the reasons stated in the Company's Petition, and noted in the Commission's Order No. 01, was that the Company's "central office switches serving its Dewatto, Roslyn, Prescott, and Uniontown wire centers are not technically capable of providing local number portability." In reaching this conclusion, the Company determined that it would need to replace its central office switches for those wire centers. The Company has a limited number of qualified personnel to complete the replacement. Accordingly, the Commission approved a plan for sequential installation of the new equipment.<sup>4</sup>
- 3. Subsequent to Order No. 01, the Company completed its comprehensive testing of its preferred vendor's replacement switch. However, it became apparent to the Company that the vendor's equipment presented significant and insurmountable technical difficulties with regard to the provision and implementation of equal access and CALEA, as well as local number portability. The

Company attempted to resolve these issues with the vendor. However, it became apparent that the vendor would not be able to solve the issues in a timely fashion. The Company terminated its relationship with that vendor and entered into a contract with a new vendor. Since the granting of Order No. 02, the Company has been working diligently with the second vendor to install the switch. However, there have been unforeseen delays. The Company is close to being able to implement switch conversion, but will not be able to accomplish that switch conversion by December 31, 2004.

- 4. Accordingly, the Company respectfully requests that the Commission grant the Company an extension of the deadline for implementing local number portability in the Roslyn wire center (RSLNWAXXCG0). The remainder of the schedule set forth in Order No. 02 for Dewatto, Prescott and Uniontown, in the Company's opinion at the present time, can remain the same. More specifically, the Company requests that the Commission issue an order for the following revised schedule for local number portability compliance: Roslyn: from December 31, 2004 to March 31, 2005. The remainder of the schedule as adopted in Order No. 02 should remain the same given what is known at the present time.
- 5. Consistent with 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(2), granting this Request will satisfy the requirements of the Act. Specifically, the Commission is authorized to grant the Company's request if the Commission determines that the extension of the suspension:
  - (A) is necessary
    - (i) to avoid a significant adverse economic impact on users of telecommunications services generally;
    - (ii) to avoid imposing a requirement that is unduly economically

#### burdensome; or

- (iii) to avoid imposing a requirement that is technically infeasible; and
- (B) is consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.<sup>5</sup>

The Commission has already found that the criteria were satisfied for a temporary suspension when it issued Order No. 01.

6. Based on the foregoing, the Company respectfully requests that the Commission grant the Company extensions, as outlined above, of the schedule for complying with local number portability to CMRS providers for each of its wire centers.
