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- 2 JUDGE MACE: Good afternoon. Let's be on the
- 3 record in Docket No. TC-041320, the application of
- 4 All-Ways Transportation, Inc., for a certificate of
- 5 public convenience and necessity to operate motor
- 6 vehicles in furnishing passenger and express service as
- 7 an auto transportation company.
- 8 My name is Theodora Mace and I'm the
- 9 administrative law judge who has been assigned to hold
- 10 hearings on this application. We are convened for a
- 11 prehearing conference on October 29th, 2004, at the
- 12 offices of the Washington Utilities and Transportation
- 13 Commission in Olympia, Washington.
- 14 What I want to do right now is take
- 15 appearances from those -- there is no one in the
- 16 hearing room, and let me indicate that for the record,
- 17 but to take appearances from those on the conference
- 18 bridge who are calling into this hearing by telephone,
- 19 and Ms. Weza, that's going to be you, and what I'm
- 20 going to ask you to do is state your full name and
- 21 address, the name of the company, indicate that you are
- 22 representing yourself in this hearing, and give me your
- 23 phone number, your fax number, if you have one, and
- 24 your e-mail address, if you have one. Could you do
- 25 that for me now, please?

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- 1 MS. WEZA: Yes. My name is Dolores Ann Weza.
- 2 I am representing All-Ways Transportation in Lewiston,
- 3 Idaho.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Can you give me the address,
- 5 please?
- 6 MS. WEZA: We are located at 931 Bryden
- 7 Avenue, Lewiston, Idaho, 83501. Our daytime and
- 8 anytime telephone number is area code (208) 746-0257.
- 9 A second line is area code (208) 746-7189. Our fax
- 10 number is area code (208) 798-0574.
- JUDGE MACE: That's your fax number?
- 12 MS. WEZA: That's the fax number. We have a
- 13 toll-free number also. Would you like that?
- JUDGE MACE: Sure.
- 15 MS. WEZA: It's 1-877-437-5237.
- JUDGE MACE: And how about an e-mail?
- MS. WEZA: Our e-mail address is
- 18 jim@syringa.net.
- 19 JUDGE MACE: Thank you. At a prehearing
- 20 conference, we usually have a number of items we need
- 21 to cover depending on the nature of the hearing. In
- 22 this case, I note that no protests have been filed, and
- 23 let me now ask to make sure that there is no one else
- on the conference bridge who wants to enter an
- 25 appearance today. I hear no response. No protests

- 1 have been filed and no one else has entered an
- 2 appearance aside from the Applicant. This means that
- 3 we can dispense with a number of items required in a
- 4 conference of this type, including whether discovery
- 5 will be necessary and whether the Commission needs to
- 6 enter a protective order.
- 7 I would like to take some time now to advise
- 8 the Applicant about the kinds of proofs that are still
- 9 required to support this application and to develop
- 10 with her a schedule of filing for those proofs. Now,
- 11 Ms. Weza, I just want to make sure that you are aware
- 12 that you still, even though this is an unprotested
- 13 application, you still need to provide proof that will
- 14 meet the requirements of the statute that covers this
- 15 type of proceeding.
- 16 The statutory requirements are found in
- 17 Chapter 81.68 RCW, and there are also requirements in
- 18 the rules of the Commission, Chapter 480-30 WAC. I'm
- 19 going to send you an appendix to the prehearing
- 20 conference order that I'm going to write and send you
- 21 after this hearing is over that gives you an outline of
- 22 these proofs, but I just want to go over this with you
- 23 now so you are aware of what you need to file.
- 24 You have to show, number one, that there is a
- 25 public need for the service you are proposing. The

- 1 need for new service must be established by means of
- 2 statements from members of the public who actually
- 3 require the service. The Commission does not accept
- 4 what it calls self-serving statements from an applicant
- 5 about this. In other words, you have to provide a
- 6 statement from someone other than from your
- 7 organization to support your application saying that
- 8 there is a need for the service. The person that you
- 9 provide the statement from has to be knowledgeable
- 10 about the need for service in the territory in which
- 11 you are seeking authority.
- 12 Also, if you are requesting a certificate to
- 13 operate in territory already served by a certificate
- 14 holder, you must show that the existing transportation
- 15 company or companies will not provide service in the
- 16 territory to the satisfaction of the Commission. This
- 17 proof may also be in the form of written statements
- 18 from independent witnesses, just as the other items can
- 19 be proved.
- Then finally, you have to show that you as an
- 21 applicant are fit, willing, and able to provide the
- 22 proposed service. You must show that you have
- 23 sufficient financial resources and assets to conduct
- 24 the proposed operations, and you must show that you are
- 25 willing and able to comply with the applicable laws and

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- 1 the Commission's rules. And that latter item, you can
- 2 provide a statement from yourself, and that's not a
- 3 problem there.
- 4 So those are the things that you are still
- 5 going to have to show to the Commission, and you can do
- 6 that, as I said, by filing written statements. So what
- 7 we have to do today is make sure that we have a
- 8 deadline by which you will file those statements so
- 9 that I can review them and make some findings to see
- 10 whether or not they do meet the requirements of the
- 11 statute.
- 12 Also, it's possible that you could what's
- 13 called waive an initial order in this case. That means
- 14 once I get the statements from you, instead of my
- 15 writing an order, that would go immediately to a final
- order of the Commission, and that way, it could
- 17 expedite the proceeding for you, and I just want to
- 18 mention that as an alternative for you so you can think
- 19 about it. The one thing it does is it eliminates one
- 20 opportunity, if you don't like what I've written in the
- 21 order, one opportunity for you to sort of protest what
- 22 I've written.
- MS. WEZA: I understand.
- 24 JUDGE MACE: Do you have any questions about
- 25 this right now?

- 1 MS. WEZA: Not really. I'm an Idaho person,
- 2 and this is the first I've come to Washington for help.
- 3 JUDGE MACE: I want to make this as smooth as
- 4 I can for you. I wish there was more that I could do,
- 5 but there isn't. I have to have you file these
- 6 statements, and I have to review them, and an order has
- 7 to be entered before any grant of authority can be
- 8 given, and I have to advise you that there is the
- 9 possibility that somehow your proofs will be found
- 10 wanting. That doesn't happen often, but I just want to
- 11 let you know there is that possibility.
- 12 So how long do you think it would take you to
- 13 supply me with the proofs that are required with these
- 14 written statements that I've mentioned?
- MS. WEZA: I would say until the 15th of
- 16 November, if it's necessary to make contacts, of
- 17 course.
- 18 JUDGE MACE: Let me just say this. It's
- 19 going to take until probably Tuesday or Wednesday next
- 20 week for me to get the prehearing conference order to
- 21 you that will give you information about the
- 22 requirements you have to meet and about the format for
- 23 filing documents and the number of copies you are going
- 24 to have to file, so you get that by November 3rd. I
- 25 know that you want to do this pretty quickly, but

- 1 November 15th comes up pretty fast. How about if we
- 2 set it for November 19th?
- MS. WEZA: November 19th is satisfactory.
- 4 JUDGE MACE: Let's just indicate that for
- 5 purposes of our schedule then, you will submit your
- 6 written proofs by November 19th, and then I will take
- 7 it from there, and hopefully, we can work quickly to
- 8 get you the relief you are requesting.
- 9 MS. WEZA: Excuse me, Judge Mace. Is there
- 10 anywhere that I can ask questions?
- JUDGE MACE: Go ahead.
- 12 MS. WEZA: I don't mean today. I mean after
- 13 I've received the papers.
- 14 JUDGE MACE: You can call the Commission. Do
- 15 you have the number for this office here, the
- 16 administrative law division?
- 17 MS. WEZA: The one that I just called?
- 18 JUDGE MACE: No, it's a different number.
- 19 It's (360) 664-1139, and if you have any questions,
- 20 that's the number you should call.
- 21 MS. WEZA: That's the office of Kippy Walker?
- JUDGE MACE: That's correct.
- 23 MS. WEZA: I do have that. Thank you anyway
- 24 though.
- JUDGE MACE: Let me make sure I've covered
