- On September 7, 2005, Northwest Telephone, Inc., (NTI) filed with the Commission a complaint against Qwest Corporation (Qwest). On September 27, 2005, Qwest filed an answer to the complaint and a motion to dismiss. On October 6, 2005, NTI filed a response opposing Qwest's motion to dismiss complaint. The complaint alleges that Qwest has breached the Interconnection Agreement between NTI and Qwest. A more detailed account of the dispute is reflected in the complaint, which is available for inspection at the Commission's office located at Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at www.wutc.wa.gov/053081. It is appropriate that the matters raised in the pleadings be brought for hearing before the Commission.

The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of telecommunications companies providing service within the state of Washington. Statutes and rules cited in the complaint include RCW 80.36.170. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapters 80.01 RCW, 80.04 RCW, 480-07 WAC, and 480-120 WAC, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.04.020, and RCW 80.04.110.

The ultimate issues involved are generally stated above and more specifically contained in the complaint.
