- Aqua Express, LLP, (Aqua Express or Company) on May 7, 2007, filed a petition with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) requesting permission to temporarily discontinue commercial ferry service pursuant to WAC 480-51-130. In its petition, the Company requests permission to extend its discontinuance of passenger-only ferry service between Kingston and Seattle, Washington, from June 4, 2007, to June 4, 2009.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, which authorizes it to regulate persons seeking to furnish commercial ferry service under RCW 81.84 and WAC 480-51. The issue in this proceeding is whether the Commission should grant permission to temporarily extend discontinuance of passenger-only ferry service from June 4, 2007, to June 4, 2009.
- 3 Statutes involved include those within RCW 81.04, RCW 81.84, and RCW 34.05, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.434, RCW 34.05.437, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.443, RCW 81.84.010, and RCW 81.84.020. Rules involved include those within WAC 480-07 and WAC 480-51.
- The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That the Commission will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 9:30 a.m., on June 14, 2007, in Room 108 of the Commission's headquarters, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.

- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as set out in WAC 480-07-430.
- Persons seeking to intervene in the proceeding must file written petitions to intervene at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). In addition, party representatives must file notices of appearance with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day before the conference. If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for the evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
