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- 2 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Let's go on the record.
- 3 Good afternoon, everyone. My name is Marguerite
- 4 Friedlander, and I'm the administrative law judge
- 5 presiding over this matter. We are here today,
- 6 Wednesday, July 29th, 2009, before the Washington
- 7 Utilities and Transportation Commission for a
- 8 prehearing conference regarding a complaint filed by
- 9 the Commission on its own motion against Cristalina,
- 10 LLC, a water company, alleging that Cristalina's rates
- 11 may be unjust and unreasonable.
- 12 The purpose of the prehearing conference
- 13 today is to take appearances of the parties, discuss a
- 14 possible procedural schedule for the Commission's
- 15 consideration of the Complaint, and address any other
- 16 procedural matters that the parties wish to raise.
- 17 Let's go ahead and get started with
- 18 appearances first. When you give your appearance,
- 19 please do so giving your full appearance; i.e., your
- 20 name, spelling of your last name, your address,
- 21 business address, telephone number, fax number, if you
- 22 have it, and an e-mail address, so let's go ahead and
- 23 start with Commission staff.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: On behalf of
- 25 Commission staff, Jennifer Cameron-Rulkowski, assistant

- 1 attorney general. My address is 1400 South Evergreen
- 2 Park Drive Southwest, PO Box 40128, Olympia,
- 3 Washington, 98504-0128. My telephone number is
- 4 (360) 664-1186. My fax number is (360) 586-5522, and

- 6 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Appearing on behalf of
- 7 Cristalina, LLC?
- 8 MS. LINDBERG: Maria Lindberg. My address is
- 9 1200 Old Fairhaven Parkway, Bellingham, Washington,
- 10 98225. My phone number is (360) 296-7321, and my
- 11 e-mail is mariarealtor@gmail.com.
- 12 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Did you have a fax number
- 13 that we could use?
- 14 MS. LINDBERG: I believe it's (360) 594 -- I
- 15 don't know what it is right now. I do have one.
- 16 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: That's fine. We have
- 17 your e-mail address and your physical address so that's
- 18 fine. Does anybody else on the conference bridge wish
- 19 to put in an appearance? I would note there is no
- 20 response on the conference bridge and there is no one
- 21 besides our staff in appearance in the hearing room.
- 22 Let's go ahead and discuss whether the
- 23 parties wish to conduct discovery, and if so, whether
- 24 you would be invoking the Commission's discovery rules.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes, Your Honor,

- 1 Staff would like to have discovery.
- 2 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you. Is there also
- 3 in that case a need for a protective order?
- 4 MS. LINDBERG: I don't think so, no. I'm not
- 5 even sure what that means.
- 6 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: The Commission can issue
- 7 a protective order in case the parties intend to
- 8 exchange confidential information that may be of a
- 9 proprietary nature in case you have commercially
- 10 sensitive or proprietary information that would be
- 11 exchanged during discovery, and if that's not the case,
- 12 then the Commission doesn't need to issue a protective
- 13 order.
- 14 MS. LINDBERG: The only thing I can think of
- 15 is one of the things they ask for is these people that
- 16 owe money. Are they supposed to be protected, or are
- 17 their names just out there? That's the only thing I
- 18 don't know.
- 19 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, at this
- 20 point, I don't see an issue that would require a
- 21 protective order, and Staff would be happy to work with
- 22 Ms. Lindberg if in the future it looks like we might
- 23 need a protective order.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: I appreciate that. We
- 25 can always draft up a protective order at some time in

- 1 the future if one is needed.
- 2 MS. LINDBERG: Okay. I don't know the law.
- 3 It just seems like letting publically know who owes how
- 4 much, I didn't know.
- 5 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you. Have the
- 6 parties also had an opportunity to discuss a procedural
- 7 schedule in this matter?
- 8 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes, Your Honor, we
- 9 have, and I have provided you with a copy of Staff's
- 10 proposed schedule, and I have e-mailed Ms. Lindberg a
- 11 copy. We are not in agreement with Item 2, and other
- 12 than that, it's my understanding that all of the other
- 13 dates work for both parties.
- 14 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you. Ms. Lindberg,
- 15 I have as Item No. 2 the deadline to submit financial
- 16 information to Staff, so that would be something that
- 17 you would be providing to them only not to the
- 18 Commission, the potential date for that being August
- 19 12th. Did you have an alternative date or replacement
- 20 date?
- MS. LINDBERG: Yes, at least a week later.
- 22 What they are asking for is a lot of work, and right
- 23 now, Cristalina has to get the papers. We are out of
- 24 water. I'm dealing with about four to five nasty
- 25 e-mails, not to mention several phone calls a day

- 1 trying to follow people up, try to figure out what the
- 2 issues are. We have like four or five different
- 3 issues. I'm on my way right now to try to get another
- 4 comprehensive plan done dealing with the Department of
- 5 Health, Section 106, trying to get an emergency okay so
- 6 we can start construction to eliminate these problems.
- 7 What they are asking for, myself and my
- 8 bookkeeper are the only people that can get this
- 9 together, and right now, I'm just scrambling with this
- 10 other issue. I'm gone the week of the 12th, so I was
- 11 hoping to have the following week to hopefully get all
- 12 this together.
- JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Staff, did you have
- 14 anybody to comment on?
- 15 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes, Your Honor. In
- 16 this particular matter, Staff has suggested that
- 17 Cristalina file a rate case and has been expecting,
- 18 based on Ms. Lindberg's representations, to actually
- 19 see a rate case come in the door, and already twice
- 20 now, nothing has come in, and so what Staff would
- 21 propose is to look at the list and to ask for
- 22 approximately half of the items on the list to be
- 23 received by Friday, August 7th, right before
- 24 Ms. Lindberg will be away, is my understanding, and
- 25 then for the rest of the items to be due on Friday,

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- 1 August 21st.
- 2 We do have some specific items in mind to
- 3 split up if this proposal is something that
- 4 Ms. Lindberg would want to consider. We could go off
- 5 the record for a few minutes and discuss splitting the
- 6 list.
- 7 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Sure.
- 8 MS. LINDBERG: Hold on a second. Someone is
- 9 beeping in on me.
- 10 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Why don't we go off the
- 11 record so we can discuss this in a little more detail.
- 12 We are off the record.
- 13 (Discussion off the record.)
- 14 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: When we went off the
- 15 record, Ms. Lindberg from Cristalina, LLC, was on the
- line as well as Staff, and we went off the record
- 17 briefly to have the parties discuss a procedural
- 18 schedule.
- 19 Unfortunately, Ms. Lindberg had car problems
- 20 and is not able to, as I understand it, communicate
- 21 with us over the conference bridge, but the parties
- 22 have on my understanding reached a procedural schedule,
- 23 so why don't we go ahead and have Staff walk us through
- 24 that.
- 25 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you, Your

- 1 Honor. The first date that we have is the deadline to
- 2 submit financial information to Staff, and that date is
- 3 August 21st, 2009, and appended to the Order Staff
- 4 would request would be a list of this financial
- 5 information, and Staff has provided you, Your Honor,
- 6 and also provided Ms. Lindberg with a copy of this
- 7 list, and there are a couple of errors on the list that
- 8 would need to be fixed.
- 9 1(a) was supposed to have been removed. That
- 10 was from a prior draft, and there are a couple of
- 11 references to proposed revenues or rates in here which
- 12 are not appropriate for this matter because there has
- 13 been no proposed rates filed, and so that would be
- 14 Item 1(f) we would be deleting and "proposed revenues,"
- 15 and Item 1(g), that would be deleting also the word
- 16 "proposed," and I'm sorry, I misspoke, Your Honor.
- 17 Item 1(f), "revenue" stays in, I believe. No, one
- 18 needs to stay and the other one needs to be deleted. I
- 19 will be circulating a revised list to you and also to
- 20 Ms. Lindberg.
- 21 Then the next date we would like to have a
- 22 settlement conference, and the date for that is
- 23 September 25th, 2009. The next date is prefiled direct
- 24 testimony and exhibits of Commission staff. The date
- 25 for that is November 6th, 2009. The next item is

- 1 prefiled responsive testimony and exhibits of
- 2 Cristalina, LLC. The date for that is December 4,
- 3 2009. The next item is prefiled rebuttal testimony and
- 4 exhibits of Commission staff. The date for that is
- 5 December 18th, 2009.
- 6 The next item has to do with preparing
- 7 exhibits for hearing, and Your Honor, please correct me
- 8 if I'm wrong, but I understand that you would be
- 9 distributing a proposed list of exhibits on January
- 10 4th, and then the parties would have until -- was that
- 11 January 6th or January 8th?
- 12 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: January 6th.
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: -- until January 6th
- 14 to respond and finalize that list. That would be 2010.
- 15 Then the next item is a hearing. That would
- 16 be January 8th, 2010, and then the parties would submit
- 17 simultaneous post-hearing briefs by February 10th,
- 18 2010.
- 19 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you. Having looked
- 20 over the procedural schedule, and I believe you had
- 21 indicated previously that Ms. Lindberg had given her
- 22 consent to this procedural schedule verbally to you?
- MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Yes, Your Honor, she
- 24 did, and I specifically asked her if it was all right
- 25 for me to represent to you today that she agreed to the

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1 schedule, and she did say yes. 2 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: Thank you so much, and I 3 will go ahead and propose that I issue an initial order by April 1st of 2010. I think that will give me enough 5 time to draft something up following the posthearing briefs. 6 7 It looks like we have taken care of the procedural schedule. Were there any other procedural 8 issues that needed to be addressed? 9 10 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Not from Staff, Your 11 Honor. 12 JUDGE FRIEDLANDER: I will note that in this 13 proceeding, the parties need to file an original and 14 seven copies of documents. If there is nothing else, 15 we will go ahead and adjourn. Thank you so much. 16 MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you, Your 17 Honor. 18 (Prehearing adjourned at 2:40 p.m.) 19 20 21 22 23
