T & T PROFESSIONAL SERVICES	ORDER 02
in the amount of \$1,000	GRANTING PAYMENT ARRANGEMENT

BACKGROUND

- 1 On July 3, 2017, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assessed a \$1,000 penalty (Penalty Assessment) against T & T Professional Services (T & T or Company) for failure to timely file an annual report and pay its regulatory fee.
- 2 On July 6, 2017, T & T contested the violation and applied for mitigation of the penalties, stating that it had submitted its annual report in the mail.
- 3 On July 20, 2017, Commission staff (Staff) filed a response recommending the Commission deny the Company's request for mitigation. On August 31, the Commission entered Order 01, Denying Request for Hearing; Denying Contest of Violations; Denying Mitigation.
- 4 On October 2, 2017, Staff contacted the Executive Director and Secretary of the Commission explaining that the Company requested to pay the penalty in five monthly installments, and that Staff supports the request. The Company and Staff jointly propose the following payment schedule:

October 5, 2017	\$200
November 6, 2017	\$200
December 5, 2017	\$200
January 5, 2018	\$200
February 5, 2018	\$200
- 5 Staff also proposes that if T & T misses one payment, the entire balance will become due and payable immediately.

DISCUSSION

- 6 The installment payment schedule Staff and the Company propose is reasonable. The Commission approves the proposal with the modification that T & T may make additional payments in advance of the payment due dates or pay an increased amount on the due dates, but no additional payment or increased amount will relieve the Company of its obligation to make timely monthly installments until the full amount is satisfied.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 7 (1) The \$1,000 penalty is due and payable to the Commission in installments as set out in paragraph 4, above.
- 8 (2) If T & T Professional Services fails to pay any installment by 5 p.m. on the date it is due, the unpaid balance will immediately become due and payable without further order by the Commission.
- 9 (3) DATED at Olympia, Washington, and effective October 6, 2017.
