б	JUDGE PEARSON: Let's go ahead and be on the
7	record. Good morning. Today is Wednesday,
8	January 22nd, 2020, and the time is 9:00 a.m.
9	My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm an
10	administrative law judge with the Washington Utilities
11	and Transportation Commission.
12	And you're here today because the Commission
13	has information that your business is or was operating
14	or advertising as a solid waste collection company
15	without the required certificate. And I spoke with
16	Ms. McPherson briefly off the record this morning, and
17	she verified that there are two solid waste carriers who
18	are here today, so the first thing we'll do is establish
19	for the record who's present. There is a court reporter
20	here seated to my left who's recording everything we
21	say, so when I call your name, please raise your hand
22	and also give a verbal response such as "here" or
23	"present."
24	So the first docket is TG-190969, David
25	Theodore Kuntz, d/b/a DK Dumpers?

1	MR. KUNTZ: Present, Your Honor.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
3	And next is Docket TG-190967, Gary Abdella?
4	MR. ABDELLA: Here, Your Honor.
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And did I pronounce
6	both your names correctly?
7	MR. ABDELLA: Yeah.
8	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So the Commission has
9	initiated an enforcement action against you and your
10	company for operating as a solid waste collection
11	company without the required certificate, which is
12	subject to penalties of up to \$1,000 per violation. And
13	at this preliminary hearing today, I'm going to ask you
14	how you choose to proceed and you have two options.
15	Your first option is to agree to cease and
16	desist operating as an unpermitted solid waste carrier.
17	And if you choose this option, then you're agreeing to
18	stop providing, offering, and advertising solid waste
19	collection services unless or until you receive a
20	certificate from the Commission. If you choose this
21	option, you'll need to show what you've done to shut
22	your business down either completely or partially. I'm
23	going to want to see proof that you're no longer
24	operating or advertising to provide solid waste
25	collection company services, for example, you'll need to
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1	prove that you've taken down or changed your website or
2	other online advertisements for your business.
3	The second option is to ask for a
4	classification hearing, and you would choose this option
5	if you believe that you're not subject to regulation by
6	the Commission. In other words, you would be denying
7	completely that you offer solid waste collection
8	services. If you choose this option, we will schedule a
9	formal evidentiary hearing at a later date where you
10	will be required to present proof that your business is
11	not subject to regulation by the Commission. The
12	hearing will be set for about a month from now with a
13	deadline a week before the hearing for both you and
14	Commission Staff to list your witnesses and file any
15	exhibits.
16	Kathryn McPherson will be speaking for
17	Commission Staff this morning. Ms. McPherson is seated
18	at this table to my right. She's a Commission
19	compliance investigator.
20	So now that we've gone over your choices,
21	I'll explain what else will happen today. In a few
22	minutes, I will call each of you up here, after I
23	sneeze excuse me and I'll swear you in so that
24	anything that you tell the Court today will be under
25	oath. And once you're sworn in, I will ask you if you
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1	understand the choices that I explained and then ask you
2	to please tell me what your choice is. And if there's
3	anything else that you want to explain to me, that will
4	be your opportunity to do that.
5	If you choose the first option, you'll need
6	to testify about how you plan to comply with the law
7	either by obtaining a certificate or by shutting down
8	the illegal portion of your business. You'll have an
9	opportunity to meet with Staff during the break in the
10	hearing to negotiate an agreed order to resolve this
11	matter. The agreed order will also deal with the
12	proposed penalty.
13	The complaint asks the Commission to
14	penalize you for engaging in business as a solid waste
15	collection company without a certificate, and the law
16	sets the maximum penalty for each violation at a
17	thousand dollars. Staff will recommend a penalty and
18	you will have a chance to reach an agreement with Staff
19	about the penalty amount, and if you are unable to
20	agree, then I will make the final decision about the
21	penalty amount after hearing arguments from both
22	parties.

8	JUDGE PEARSON: I understand. We have a lot
9	of carriers who come in for classification hearings who
10	weren't aware of the Commission's role in regulating
11	either solid waste or passenger transportation or
12	household goods moving service, so your story is is
13	one that I hear a lot.
14	So now that you know, however, we just want
15	to make sure that you understand which activities
16	require a solid waste permit and which services do not
17	and come to an understanding that you agree to cease and
18	desist engaging in those regulated activities unless or
19	until you obtain a certificate.
20	MR. KUNTZ: And I like I told her
21	yesterday, I will I I haven't even I quit doing
22	it once I got subpoenaed to come here
23	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
24	MR. KUNTZ: and I really don't have any

18	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So I think that when
19	we take a break and you have an opportunity to meet with
20	Staff, they can provide you with some technical
21	assistance about how to go about shutting your business
22	down and making sure that you close all those loops,
23	okay?
24	So when we take a break, like I mentioned
25	earlier, you can discuss the proposed penalty with Staff
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1	and see if you can come to an agreement about the
2	penalty amount and potentially a payment plan and then
3	see if you're able to sign an agreed order. So the
4	order will say that you agree that you were in the past
5	operating and advertising without a certificate and that
6	you agree to stop operating as a solid waste collection
7	company.
8	And then once you feel comfortable that you
9	understand the order, you and Staff will both sign it.
10	Again, it will likely include an agreed penalty amount.
11	The penalty may be small or there may be a reason that
12	Staff asks for a larger penalty. That usually only
13	happens if you've been here before, but this is your
14	first time, so that's unlikely. In most instances, part
15	of the penalty is suspended, so that means you wouldn't
16	have to pay it unless you break the law again. So it
17	would just be like it would be like I can't
18	remember what it's called when you get a traffic ticket
19	and they they let you go two years, and if you don't
20	get any more traffic tickets, you don't have to pay it.
21	It's the same type of situation.
22	MR. KUNTZ: Okay.

1	6th, March 6th, April 6th, and May 6th?	
2	MR. ABDELLA: Yes.	
3	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Okay. So the order	
4	will reflect that payment.	
5	MR. ABDELLA: I apologize. I didn't know it	
6	was an option. I was just trying to get it paid as fast	
7	as I could.	
8	JUDGE PEARSON: That's fine.	
9	Okay. So we will take another brief recess	
10	because I think this means you need to print again, huh?	
11	MS. MCPHERSON: Yeah.	
12	(A break was taken from	
13	10:04 a.m. to 10:08 a.m.)	
14	JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be back on the record.	
15	We have the order that's been signed by both parties and	
16	myself as well as the updated payment arrangement	
17	attached as an exhibit to the order.	
18	And, Mr. Abdella, we will make a copy for	
19	you that you can take with you, and then once you	
20	receive that, you're free to go.	
21	MR. ABDELLA: Thank you.	
22	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thanks so much for	
23	being here today.	
24	MR. ABDELLA: Thank you.	
25	JUDGE PEARSON: Mr. Kuntz, if you could come	
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1	forward. Okay. So it sounds like you had a chance to
2	read the order and that you understand its contents,
3	that you're okay with it, but you want to talk to me
4	about the penalty?
5	MR. KUNTZ: Yes, Your Honor.
б	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
7	MR. KUNTZ: So right now, I am really going
8	through a tough time. I'm getting a divorce, rough
9	divorce, I'm a single dad, I just lost my job. I don't
10	have the \$500 to pay, and I'm afraid if I set up
11	something, I won't be able to pay it, and I don't really
12	want to mess that up. You know, we we talked and she
13	told me the rule I get the rules now. She explained
14	them a little better, and I understand all that, and
15	this whole thing was just a big miscommunication. And I
16	understand I did advertise, I just my financial
17	situation is so bad right now that I'm just drowning.
18	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I'm certainly
19	sympathetic to that.
20	Ms. McPherson, would you be amenable to
21	suspending the entire penalty amount for two years with
22	the understanding that if he advertises or offers these
23	services again, the entire \$2,000 penalty will become
24	due?
25	And also you could potentially be subject to

1	new penalties for those violations.
2	MR. KUNTZ: I totally understand that and I
3	will not break that.
4	MS. MCPHERSON: My opinion is that there
5	should be some type of financial penalty. Even if it
6	wasn't paid today, that there should be some portion of
7	even the suspended 500 even if it's only a hundred
8	dollars. If we had a traffic ticket where there was a
9	speeding incident, you would still be responsible for
10	that. Delaying the payment for up to three months and
11	letting him have the time to get a job and back on his
12	feet and then having the remainder suspended for two
13	years with me doing compliance follow-ups on the
14	company's advertising and practices.
15	JUDGE PEARSON: That sounds fair to me.
16	Would that be workable for you to have three
17	months to come up with a hundred dollars?
18	MR. KUNTZ: I I can more than likely do
19	that. I mean, if for some reason I I'm almost a
20	hundred percent positive I can do that.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
22	MR. KUNTZ: But if for some reason, I can
23	call you guys if
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Yes.
25	MR. KUNTZ: Okay.

1	JUDGE PEARSON: If you encounter some other
2	additional hardship, like I said to Mr. Abdella, the key
3	is communication and letting us know what's going on so
4	that we can make arrangements.
5	MR. KUNTZ: Now, say I get \$40 extra and I
6	want to just come down and put \$40 down, can I do
7	that
8	JUDGE PEARSON: Absolutely.
9	MR. KUNTZ: over the three months?
10	JUDGE PEARSON: I think what would probably
11	be best is rather than set specific payment dates, just
12	say that no later than April 22nd, 2020, you will pay a
13	\$100 penalty in whatever amount installments in whatever
14	time so long as that entire hundred dollars has been
15	paid by April 22nd, 2020; does that work?
16	MR. KUNTZ: Yes.
17	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
18	MR. KUNTZ: And I can still call if for some
19	reason
20	JUDGE PEARSON: Yes.
21	MR. KUNTZ: Okay.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: If you need more time or,
23	like I said, some other hardship or other circumstances
24	come up, the most important thing is to let
25	Ms. McPherson know and not to just let it blow by,

1	because if that happens, then the 1900 will become due
2	and payable.
3	MR. KUNTZ: Okay.
4	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay?
5	MR. KUNTZ: Thank you.
6	JUDGE PEARSON: So do we need to take a
7	short break and you can
8	MS. MCPHERSON: Short break and I can redo
9	the documents.
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
11	(A break was taken from
12	10:12 a.m. to 10:19 a.m.)
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be back on the record.
14	So looks like there were also two violations in this
15	case; one for offering solid waste hauling services and
16	one for advertising; is that correct?
17	MS. MCPHERSON: That is correct, Your Honor.
18	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And the \$2,000
19	penalty will be imposed. A \$1,900 portion of that will
20	be suspended, and the company has agreed to make a \$100
21	payment today; is that correct?
22	MS. MCPHERSON: That is correct.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: And for the record,
24	Mr. Kuntz, you're agreeing to shut down or cease
25	offering solid waste carrier services unless you get a

1	certificate; is that correct?
2	MR. KUNTZ: Yes, Your Honor.
3	JUDGE PEARSON: So the \$1900 is suspended
4	for two years from today's date, which is
5	January 22nd, 2022, which means that if Staff finds an
6	advertisement or you offer solid waste collection
7	services during that time, you will have to pay the
8	entire \$1900 penalty, and you understand that?
9	MR. KUNTZ: Yes. I got one question.
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Sure.
11	MR. KUNTZ: So like I've advertised a lot on
12	a lot of different Facebook groups over the months, and
13	I think I because I'm not good with that, I had
14	someone come help me go back and try to find all those
15	old posts and erase them, and I think we got all of
16	them, but what if an old one pops up?
17	JUDGE PEARSON: I think if an old one pops
18	up, Ms. McPherson will recognize it as one that she's
19	already seen.
20	MR. KUNTZ: Okay.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: And like I explained to you
22	earlier, maybe it was Mr. Abdella, that if you get
23	somebody asking for those services
24	MR. KUNTZ: Yeah.
25	JUDGE PEARSON: you need to say no.
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1	MR. KUNTZ: I heard that.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: That's the most important
3	thing because you never know if it will be Ms. McPherson
4	posing as someone else.
5	MR. KUNTZ: I totally understand the rules
6	now.
7	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Okay. And then the
8	cease and desist order is permanent, it never expires.
9	Just like I explained to Mr. Abdella, that even if after
10	two years, we were to find that you were still offering
11	or advertising those services, Staff can go straight to
12	superior court and ask for much higher penalties. So
13	it's very important that you follow the law.
14	And let's see, I think that's it because
15	you've made your payment or you will be making your
16	payment today. And unless you have any additional
17	questions, we've all three already signed the order so
18	you will get a copy of it before you leave here today.
19	Is there anything else?
20	MR. KUNTZ: No, that's it.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you so much for
22	coming today.
23	MR. KUNTZ: Thank you.
24	JUDGE PEARSON: All right.
25	MR. KUNTZ: So I just go out here and

1	JUDGE PEARSON: Mm-hmm.
2	We are adjourned. Thank you.
