RE: In the Matter of the Penalty Assessment Against Kyle Mathison Orchards in the Amount of \$3,000, Docket DG-210067

TO ALL PARTIES:

On April 6, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assessed a \$3,000 penalty (Penalty Assessment) against Kyle Mathison Orchards (KMO or Company) for three violations of Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 19.122.030(2). In the Penalty Assessment, the Commission offered the Company the option to suspend and ultimately waive the penalty subject to the conditions that: a) KMO supervisors and applicable field staff attend National Utility Contractors Association Dig Safe online training, and b) the Company commit no further violations of RCW 19.122 within 12 months from the date of the Penalty Assessment.

On April 19, 2021, the Company notified the Commission that it accepted the conditions.

On April 14, 2022, Commission staff (Staff) filed a letter informing the Commission that the Company had verified completion of the required training and that KMO had not incurred any additional violations of the dig law since the Penalty Assessment. In its letter, Staff recommends the Commission waive the \$3,000 suspended penalty and close the docket.

The Commission agrees that KMO has complied with the conditions of the Penalty Assessment. The \$3,000 suspended penalty is thus waived, and this docket is closed.
