DENYING PETITIONS FOR LESS THAN STATUTORY NOTICE FOR 45 DAY NOTICE TO COMMISSION; GRANTING PETITIONS FOR LESS THAN STATUTORY NOTICE FOR CUSTOMER NOTICE TO BE APPLIED ON FIRST BILL

BACKGROUND

In August of 2025, several affiliated Waste Connections companies (Waste Connections or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) petitions for an order authorizing less than statutory notice (LSNs) for (1) 45-day notice to the Commission and (2) customer notice requirements. The filings each relate to a statewide business and occupation (B&O) tax increase set to become effective October 1, 2025. The LSNs specifically request exemption from customer notice requirements pursuant to WAC 480-70-271(2)(a) and for the tariffs to become effective October 1, 2025. The Waste Connection companies which filed these requests, and the date on which they filed, are as follows:

- Commission Staff (Staff) has reviewed the LSNs for Waste Connections and agrees with Waste Connections that the historic practice has been to allow Waste Connections and others to notify customers of these changes on their first bills pursuant to WAC 480-70-271(2)(a), which avoids increased costs associated with printing and postage.
- However, Staff recommends that to the extent the LSNs request the change in rates due to B&O tax increases become effective October 1, 2025, that the Commission deny those requests and that the Commission approve the tariff effective dates submitted by the various Waste Connections companies as filed.

DISCUSSION AND DECISION

- RCW 81.28.050 states, in part, that for "a solid waste collection company, a change [in rates] may not be made except after forty-five days' notice to the commission and to the public." WAC 480-70-271(2)(a) provides that advance notice of a rate increase to customers for solid waste companies may be exempted, but that "[e]ach affected customer must receive notice on or with the first bill after the final commission decision when a company increases rates for ... local taxes..."
- Here, the Company has petitioned the Commission to allow it to provide notice of the rate increases to customers associated with the increase to B&O taxes on customers' first bill. We grant that request as consistent with prior Commission practice and Commission rule.
- The Company also appears to request an exemption from RCW 81.28.050 in its LSNs. However, we note that the tariffs submitted by the Company and the effective date of each tariff reflect compliance with RCW 81.28.050 and provide 45-days' notice to the Commission of the rate change.

- Accordingly, it is not entirely clear whether the Company meant to petition the Commission for exemption from RCW 81.28.050. Regardless, out of an abundance of caution, we interpret the Company's LSNs to request an exemption from statute, which we deny.
- The Company's tariff increase instead shall become effective on the date provided in each tariff submitted, and as shown in Appendix A of this Order. Because the Company submitted the correct effective dates in tariff, there is no need for the Company to submit replacement pages to the Commission.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 9 (1) The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate the rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, transfers of property, and affiliated interests of public service companies, including solid waste companies.
- 10 (2) Waste Connections and its subsidiaries are solid waste companies and public service companies subject to Commission jurisdiction.
- 11 (3) RCW 81.28.050 states, in part, that solid waste companies must provide forty-five days' notice to the commission before increasing rates.
- 12 (4) WAC 480-70-271(2)(a) provides solid waste companies may provide notice to customers of increases due to changes in taxes on the customers' first bill after commission decisions.
- The Waste Connections companies submitted petitions for less than statutory notice, authorizing them to provide notice to customers of increases in rates due to increases in the B&O tax and to increase said rates on October 1, 2025.
- The Commission should grant the Waste Connections companies' request to provide customer notice on less than statutory notice on customers' first bills, but should deny the companies' request to increase rates effective October 1, 2025.

The Commission should approve the rate increases due to the increase in B&O tax for each Waste Connections company consistent with the tariff effectives dates submitted by the companies and as shown in Appendix A.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 16 (1) The Commission finds Waste Connections request to provide less than statutory notice to customers pursuant to WAC 480-70-271(2)(a) in these dockets is GRANTED.
- The Commission finds Waste Connections request for less than statutory notice to the Commission is DENIED, and the tariff effective dates shall correspond to those submitted by Waste Connections in each docket, as shown in Appendix A.
- 18 (3) The Commission retains jurisdiction over this matter for purposes of effectuating this Order.
