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- 1 As I said earlier, we've done 200,000 of these
- 2 and we have incredibly high industry leading customer
- 3 satisfaction, and part of the reason for that is we go
- 4 above and beyond both the background checks and
- 5 insurance requirements that I require by State
- 6 regulations. And it serves our interest exceptionally
- 7 well to make sure that every customer who uses Dolly is
- 8 one that is incredibly satisfied with the service,
- 9 otherwise we just don't have a business. And that's
- 10 what we started and set out to do from day one.
- So a big part of what we've been doing is, I
- 12 think, taking stuff that has been frankly performed in
- 13 the shadow market where consumers have been going on
