COMMISSION STAFF'S MOTION TO COMPEL VERIZON TO COMPLY WITH THE THIRD SUPPLEMTAL ORDER

The Commission Staff (Staff) moves the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) to compel Verizon Northwest, Inc. (Verizon) to comply with the Commission's Third Supplemental Order in this docket.

## BACKGROUND

On August 13, 2002, in the Third Supplemental Order in this docket, the Commission reaffirmed its earlier order requiring Verizon to provide updated loop length studies. *See In the Matter of Review of Unbundled Loop and Switching Rates and Review of the Deaveraged Zone Rate Structure*, Docket No. UT-023003, Third Supplemental Order, Attachment A, (August 13, 2002) (*citing In the Matter of the Continued Costing and Pricing of Unbundled Network Elements, Transport, and Termination,* Thirty-Second Supplemental Order; Part B Order, ¶ 61 (June 21, 2002).

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3	On February 20, 2003, the Commission issued its Fifth Supplemental Order in
	this docket, establishing a procedural schedule. In the Matter of Review of Unbundled
	Loop and Switching Rates and Review of the Deaveraged Zone Rate Structure, Docket No. UT-
	023003, Fifth Supplemental Order (February 20, 2003). According to that Order, the
	Commission Staff must file its direct testimony regarding the proper cost for Verizon's
	loops by June 26, 2003. <i>Id.</i> ¶ 7.
4	On August 20, 2002, the Staff submitted to Verizon its Data Request No. 5, which
	is set forth as follows:
	The Third Supplemental Order in this docket directed Verizon to provided updated loop length studies. Please indicate when such studies will be completed and provide the studies to staff as soon as they become available.
5	On September 4, 2002, Verizon responded to this data request as follows:
	Verizon will provide the data as soon as it is available. However, experience has shown that it will take four to five months to collect the data ordered in the Third Supplemental Order of UT-023003.
6	Verizon has not provided the updated loop length studies.
MOTION	
7	This docket was opened in order to review the unbundled loop rates of Verizon
	and Qwest Corporation (Qwest). Verizon's revised loop length studies are directly
	relevant to the scope of this docket. The Staff must have Verizon's updated studies in
	order to prepare its direct testimony that is due on June 26, 2003.

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The Commission ordered Verizon to provide updated loop length studies on June 21, 2002. On September 4, 2002, Verizon said it would take "four to five months" to provide the studies. At the outside range of this estimate, Verizon should have produced its updated loop length study by February 7, 2003. However, Verizon has not produced the study. In fact, it has been nearly a year since the Commission ordered Verizon to update its loop length study.

Verizon has informed the Staff that it cannot produce the study until June 6, 2003. However, this date comes much too late for the Staff and prejudices Staff's ability to adequately prepare its testimony. Staff's testimony is due on June 26, 2003, and Staff requires at least four weeks to evaluate the study in order to prepare its testimony.

## **RELIEF REQUESTED**

The Commission Staff requests the Commission order Verizon to produce an updated loop length study by <u>no later than</u> May 30, 2003
