Supervisor Katy called me about 2:30a and told me that we are experiencing a 911 outage, affecting most of Western Washington.

Mike Mandella requested that I come onsite ASAP, so I am at the office.

Steve Lagreid from KC E911 said that is a possible equipment failure, and is affecting ALL of Washington and parts of Oregon!

Mike is being interviewed by King 5 news.

The news media has been alerted to tell the populations to use 10-digit emergency numbers, and not 9-1-1. The dispatch center has been watching the news channels and websites and verifying that the posted phone numbers are correct.

I listened to the radio during my drive in but didn't hear anything there. I suggested to Katy that we expand to all radio markets as well. She said they are looking into a EAS broadcast.

Century Link has no ETA for a fix.
