GRANTING MOTION TO MODIFY PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

BACKGROUND

- On January 6, 2016, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) entered Order 05, the final order in this proceeding. Subsequently, on March 18, 2016, the Public Counsel Unit of the Attorney General's Office (Public Counsel) filed a petition for judicial review in the Superior Court for Thurston County. On April 29, 2016, the Thurston County Superior Court certified the case for direct review by the Court of Appeals of Washington, Division Two, and the Court of Appeals reversed in part the Commission's Order 05. The Court of Appeals subsequently remanded the proceeding to the Commission, and on April 16, 2019, the Thurston County Superior Court remanded the matter to the Commission to effectuate the decision of the Court of Appeals.
- The Commission convened a prehearing conference on May 24, 2019. During the prehearing conference, the parties proposed a procedural schedule. On May 29, 2019, the Commission entered Order 07, adopting the procedural schedule proposed by the parties.
- On August 14, 2019, all parties to the remanded proceeding² filed a motion to amend the procedural schedule to delay by ten days the date for the filing of Staff, Public Counsel and Intervenor Response Testimony, from August 20, 2019, to August 30, 2019.

The Joint Movants state that this change will not delay the ultimate disposition of this case, but will allow more time to discuss possible settlement alternatives following the first settlement conference in the remanded proceeding.

DISCUSSION

Under WAC 480-07-375(1)(b), parties may file procedural motions requesting that the Commission modify the procedural schedule in a proceeding. Because all parties to the proceeding are in agreement on the proposed amendment to the procedural schedule, and to support the efficient resolution of the matter, the Commission grants the Join Movants' Motion to Modify Procedural Schedule, as indicated in Appendix A to this order.³

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT the Joint Motion to Amend Procedural Schedule of Avista Corporation, the Staff of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, the Office of Public Counsel, and the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers is GRANTED.
