## Recommendation

1. Issue a Complaint and Order Suspending the Tariff Revisions filed by Waste Management of Washington, Inc., d/b/a Brem-Air Disposal.

2. Allow temporary rates at the staff recommended revised rates to become effective October 15, 2007, subject to refund.

## **Discussion**

On August 31, 2007, Waste Management of Washington, Inc., d/b/a Brem-Air Disposal (Brem-Air or company), filed a general rate increase for solid waste service and rates for a new residential curbside recycle service. Kitsap County ordinance 379-2007 has mandated a single stream curbside recycling program be implemented by October 1, 2007. The company serves approximately 42,000 customers in Kitsap County. The last general rate increase has been in effect since 2001. The overall impact of the proposed filing will be approximately \$861,700 (6.56 percent). The major drivers of the proposed revision are increases in labor, benefits and fuel expenses. All other expense categories with the exception of disposal fees have increased at varying levels since the last increase.

The commission has received 18 comments in response to the filing. A count of issues from these customers is as follows:

Staff's review of Brem-Air's operations revealed that some proposed rates were excessive. On

October 5, 2007, the company filed revised rates at the staff recommended level. The revised rates generate approximately \$769,218 (5.89 percent). Although the company filed revised rates at lower levels, customers have not yet been advised that staff and the company have agreed to revised rates and they have not had the opportunity to comment on the revised rates. Customers deserve to know about, and comment on, the revised rates. The commission should consider all information, including any additional customer comments on the revised rates, in deciding whether to approve the revised rates.
