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5 THE COURT: Let's be on the record in docket  
6 UW-140595, captioned Washington Utilities and Transportation  
7 Commission versus Eastwood Park Water Company, Inc. We are  
8 here on Thursday, October 2nd, 2014, at 9:30 a.m. for a  
9 prehearing conference to discuss scheduling and other  
10 procedural issues.

11 My name is Rayne Pearson, and I am the administrative  
12 law judge presiding over this case. So let's get started by  
13 taking appearances with commission staff.

14 MR. FASSIO: Good morning, your Honor. Michael  
15 Fassio, assistant attorney general, for commission staff. I  
16 have filed a full notice of appearance in the docket that has  
17 all of my information, and I have also served it on Mr. Green.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. And for the company?

19 MR. GREEN: Robert Green.

20 THE COURT: Okay. Can we get your address, phone  
21 number and e-mail, if you have one.

22 MR. GREEN: E-mail is RobertG@JohnLScott.com.

23 THE COURT: Okay.

24 MR. GREEN: Address is PO Box -- PO Box 340, Spanaway,  
25 Washington 98378.

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1 THE COURT: And your phone number.

2 MR. GREEN: (253) 380-8421.

3 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you. I don't see any other  
4 parties here seeking intervention, and I didn't receive any  
5 information about that in advance. And let's see. Do you want  
6 the discovery rules to be available in this case?

7 MR. FASSIO: That's fine, your Honor. I don't  
8 anticipate there will be a need for discovery, but --

9 THE COURT: Just in case.

10 MR. FASSIO: It's customary to invoke those in case.

11 THE COURT: Okay. And do both parties consent to  
12 electronic service, if the commission decides to serve  
13 documents in this manner? Meaning that you would receive a  
14 copy via e-mail.

15 MR. GREEN: Right.

16 THE COURT: Is that okay with you?

17 MR. GREEN: Uh-huh, yeah.

18 THE COURT: Okay.

19 MR. FASSIO: That's fine.

20 THE COURT: Okay. So that brings us to the schedule,  
21 and I understand that you have a schedule worked out already.

22 MR. FASSIO: We have. Yes, we have, your Honor.

23 THE COURT: Okay. Do you want to go ahead and read  
24 that into the record?

25 MR. FASSIO: Yes. The parties have agreed to an

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1 initial settlement conference on October 9th at the  
2 commission's offices here. We will work out the time, but we  
3 expect that to be in the morning.

4 And we have -- we would propose a hearing date for  
5 December 15th. If that date is not available, we -- we would  
6 be available on December 16th as well for an evidentiary  
7 hearing.

8 And the -- we've also discussed a date for  
9 distributing witness list and exhibits between the parties, one  
10 week prior to the hearing or December 8th.

11 THE COURT: Okay. So my preference is the 15th for  
12 the hearing date, because the Pacific Correlate case begins on  
13 the 16th.

14 MR. FASSIO: Uh-huh.

15 THE COURT: So that would be my preference.

16 MR. FASSIO: Okay. And if -- our preference is in the  
17 afternoon of the 15th.

18 THE COURT: Okay.

19 MR. FASSIO: We anticipate that it would take no more  
20 than a half a day for hearing.

21 THE COURT: That's fine with me. So maybe 1:30? Is  
22 that a good time?

23 MR. GREEN: Uh-huh.

24 THE COURT: Okay.

25 MR. GREEN: That's on the 15th?

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1 THE COURT: Yeah. And I assume the settlement  
2 conference will be the parties only.

3 MR. FASSIO: Parties only; that's correct.

4 THE COURT: Okay. Okay. Thank you. Is there  
5 anything else is that we need to address?

6 MR. FASSIO: I don't -- I don't believe so, your  
7 Honor. I believe there was a -- it should be reflected in the  
8 record, but Mr. Green did file a response to the investigation  
9 report, and I believe that we did receive a copy of that, and I  
10 believe that has been filed in the docket.

11 THE COURT: Yes, I received it yesterday, so --

12 MR. FASSIO: But other than that, I don't think we  
13 have any other things that we wish to bring forward today.

14 THE COURT: Okay. Anything else?

15 MR. GREEN: No.

16 THE COURT: Okay. Then we're adjourned. Thank you.
