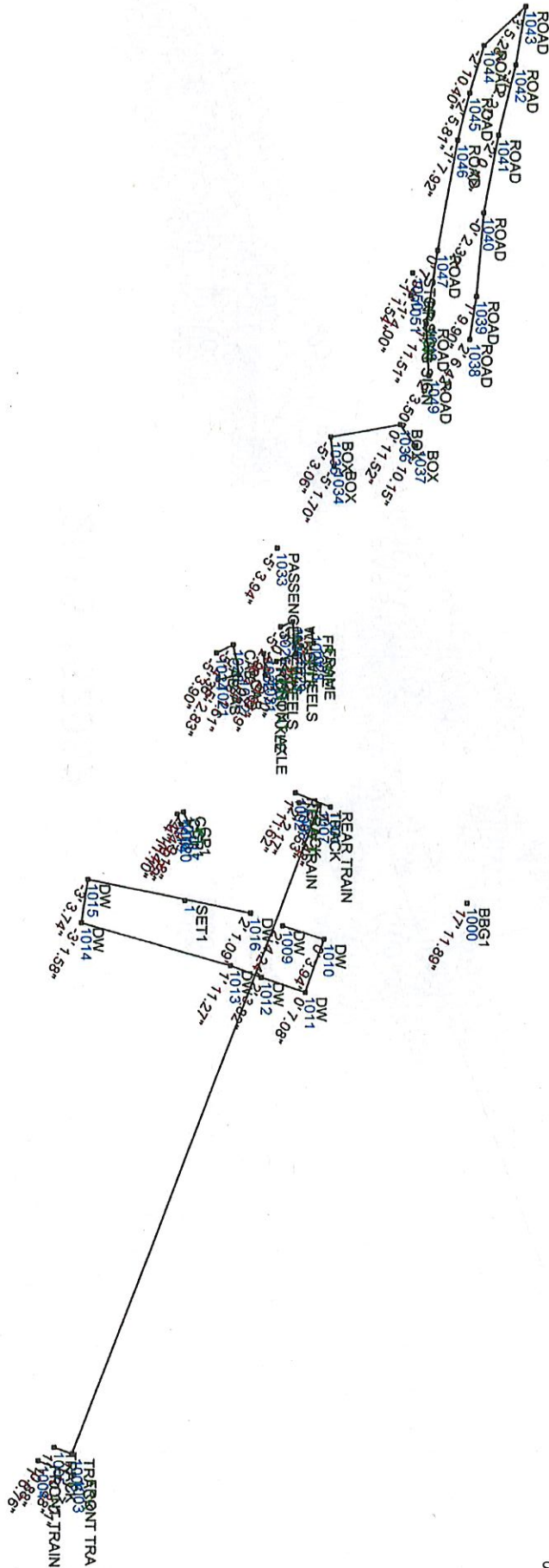

On 09-27-16 at approx 1830 hrs, Sgt Kahler contacted me via telephone and asked for me to respond to the 32100 Blk of Pioneer Hwy for a reported fatality collision involving a truck and a train. Sgt Kahler assigned me as the lead detective for this case. On arrival, I was briefed by Sgt Kahler.

I walked through the scene and observed a farm type truck with extensive damage on the west side of the tracks. There was a large farm box that had separated from the truck as a result of the collision. There was a large amount of potatoes on the ground located all around the box over to 92 Av NW to the north. The train was stopped and had been separated by railroad personnel to allow medical personnel to attend to the injured occupants of the truck.

**Collision Description:** This collision occurred at a private railroad crossing on 92 Av NW at MP 58.9 of the BNSF main line. The DOT crossing number for the crossing is 84722N.

**Pre-Impact:** The train was traveling southbound on the BNSF main line approaching a private railroad crossing at 92 Av NW. The truck (driven by Jesus Torres-Aranda) was traveling on 92 Av NW in a southeast direction approaching the railroad crossing.

**Impact:** The train struck the truck just behind the cab on the drivers side as it crossed the tracks at the railroad crossing.

**Post-Impact:** The train continued south until the conductor was able to bring it to a stop. The truck was thrown to a grassy area to the southwest of the impact area facing westbound. The box on the truck that was loaded with potatoes separated from the vehicle and came to rest just to the southwest of the impact area spilling the load of potatoes.

**Investigation:**

I asked Det Goffin to take pictures of the scene. I saw that the train was separated at a driveway located at 32110 Pioneer Highway. The engines with multiple cars was located to the south of the driveway and the rest was located to the north of the driveway. I was informed that BNSF personnel ( Division Train Master: Elgin S. Hawkins 425-212-8744 ) separated the train and moved it to allow medical personnel to provide aid to the injured occupants of the truck.

I used my engineer roller wheel to measure the length of the front part of the train from the back of the last box car to the front engine. The length of that part of the train was 1195.5 feet. Det Goffin walked with me and took pictures of the damage to the lead locomotive engine (BNSF#2620) of the train. There were three locomotive engines for the train. There was significant damage to the right front side of the engine and down the right side of the engine as well. Damage included multiple broken air line fittings, a broken fuel filler cap, dented fuel tanks and broken and bent railings down the right side of the engine. Det Goffin documented the damage with pictures. He also returned to the

scene on 09-28-16 and took daytime photos.

I contacted the conductor Ben Pratt and obtained information on the train. He told me the engineer was Mark Olson and the brakeman was Brett Heigert. He said he thought the train was traveling at 40-45 mph at the time of the collision. The Event Data Recorder (EDR) for the train showed the speed of the train at 42 mph. He said he they were able to stop the train in approx. 600-700 feet. There were 70 cars on the train including three locomotive/engines. The length of the train was 4639 feet with a tonnage of 5131 tons of weight. Pratt said he saw the truck approaching the track at a slow speed. He said the engineer was using the train's whistle at the time but the truck failed to stop and the train struck the truck.

The train's engineer was identified as Mark Olson. Olson said as the train was traveling southbound and he saw the truck approaching the railroad crossing in front of them. He said he continued to blow the train's whistle but the truck did not stop so he placed the train into emergency status to stop the train but the train hit the truck.

The truck was down into a grass field at 32110 Pioneer Highway. The driver, later identified as Jesus Torres-Aranda, was still inside of the passenger compartment of the truck. There was extensive damage to the truck. The front axle was broken and separated from the truck. There was a large dent behind the cab of the truck indicative of impact from the train. The driver's seat was shoved forward towards the front of the vehicle from the train impact. Torres-Aranda's head and upper torso was located through the front windshield of the truck. The truck's frame was twisted and separated from the cab. The box that the truck had been carrying loaded with potatoes disengaged from the truck and was located to the north of the truck. Most of the potato load was dumped on the ground between the box and the point of impact. There was debris from the truck located on the ground around the vehicle as well as further south of the truck's final resting point.

A passenger of the truck, later identified as Aaron Taylor, was transported to Providence Colby Campus prior to my arrival. His approximate location was marked in the grassy area between the truck and the box.

Det Monson and I set up the VX Spatial station and mapped the scene. I manned the prism pole while Det Monson entered the information into the data collector. We mapped the scene including the vehicle locations, roadway, truck parts and the location of Taylor on the ground. I later downloaded the information from the data collector at my office and created a scale drawing of the scene. I was able to determine that the two parts of the train were approx 195 1/2 feet apart on the tracks after being separated. The distance from the point of impact to the front portion of the separated back part of the train was approx 102 feet. If I take into account the separated portion of the train, the distance from point of impact and the length of the front portion of the train (1195.5 feet), I can conclude that the train was able to stop in approx 1102 feet from the point of impact.

The truck came to rest approx 89 feet to the southwest from the point of impact. The box of the truck came to rest approx 16 feet southwest of the point of impact. Taylor was located between the box and cab of the truck approx 52 feet from the point of impact.

Witness Glen Nash said he and his wife Nancy were driving northbound on Pioneer Highway and looked to the west and he saw Torres-Aranda approaching the railroad crossing in the potato truck. He said the truck drove right onto the center of the tracks and was hit by the train. He said the truck flew into the air and then he lost sight of the truck as the train passed by. He said he stopped approx 1/4 mile down the road and called 9-1-1 and then went back to the scene. He said he provided aid to Taylor. He said he saw Torres-Aranda still in the cab of the truck.

Witness Cassidy Sorenson said he driving southbound on Pioneer Highway and was slowly overtaking the BNSF train. He said just as he was passing the train, he heard the trains horn blowing (one long, two short, one long and then a constant horn). He said he saw a red truck (Torres-Aranda) approaching the private railroad crossing at a 45 degree angle . He said Torres-Aranda did not stop and the train hit the truck just behind the cab.

Investigators (Chelsea Warneke and Lauren Alvarez) from the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene to conduct their preliminary investigation. They took pictures and obtained information from me in reference to the train. Torres-Aranda's son, Jesus Torres-Velazquez (4b) (4b), was on scene. The ME investigators contacted Torres-Velazquez and turned over his fathers personal property to him. They took custody of Torres-Aranda's body and transported him to the medical examiner's office. The ME case number is 16SN1732.

09-28-16- I contacted Providence Hospital to check on the status of Taylor and was informed that he had been transferred to Harborview Medical Center for treatment of his injuries. I contacted Harborview Medical Center, Taylor was in surgery and would not be available for an interview for several days.

10-06-16- I was contacted Andrew Day (BNSF), Senior Claims Representative. He was requesting information on Taylor. He also stated that there was video from the train and he would make that available next week if I wanted to view it. (scheduled for 10-11-16 at 1230 hrs).

10-07-16- I responded to Harborview Medical Center and contacted Taylor on the trauma ward and obtained a statement from him. Taylor said Jesus Torres-Aranda was driving the truck from the fields (he said they had made approx 15 loads from that field that day) located to the west of the tracks. He said they were approaching the tracks at 5-10 mph. He said Torres-Aranda never stopped and never looked back to see if a train was coming. Taylor said he looked across into the drivers side outside mirror and saw the lights of the train approaching their location. He said he opened the door of the truck

and jumped. He said he remembered waking up and people were around him helping him. He said he did not remember hearing any whistles from the train. Based on the location of Taylor post collision (52 feet from impact), I think he decided he wanted to jump from the truck and started to open the door but the train struck the truck first and he was then ejected from the truck.

10-11-16- Day came to my office to let me view the video from engine BNSF2620. I watched the video which showed Torres-Aranda approaching the train crossing from the northwest at a slow speed (consistent with 5-10 mph reported by Taylor). The video confirms that Torres-Aranda never stopped at the posted stop sign/railroad crossing signs before starting over the tracks. I could hear the train whistle which was required by signal boards located on the side of the tracks prior to railroad crossings. I could hear the escape of air from the engine just prior to the collision which is consistent with the train being placed in emergency status. I then heard the brakes on the train engage just after the collision. Day told me the maximum speed for the train on the tracks in that area is 60 mph. He told me the train was already slowing down prior to the collision because it was due to go on a side track prior to Stan wood to allow another train to pass. Per BNSF policy, they do not make copies of the video, however, the copy of the video is secured by BNSF if further litigation is necessary.

11-14-16- I received a copy of the autopsy results on Torres-Aranda. The autopsy revealed multiple blunt force injuries to the torso, head and extremities for Torres-Aranda. His toxicology results were all negative for drugs and alcohol.

**Weather:** The weather at the time of the collision was clear with a temperature around 60 degrees.

**Roadway Description:** The BNSF tracks run generally from north to south in the area of the collision. The tracks are marked with the standard railroad signage.

92 Av NW is a private gravel road which runs from northwest to southeast in the area of the collision as it approaches the private railroad crossing just to the west of Pioneer Highway. The road runs at an approx 45 degree angle as it approaches the railroad crossing. The railroad crossing has a posted stop sign (approx 44 feet from the tracks) and a railroad crossing sign (approx 34 feet from the tracks).

**Causation/Conclusion:** The cause of this collision is Torres-Aranda failed to stop at the posted stop sign and railroad crossing sign at 92 Av NW and DOT crossing 84722N. He failed to yield to the train and was struck by the southbound BNSF train.

**NARRATIVE**

On 09-27-16 at approx 1830 hrs, Sgt Kahler contacted me via telephone and asked for me to respond to the 32100 Blk of Pioneer Hwy for a reported fatality collision involving a truck and a train. Sgt Kahler assigned me as the lead detective for this case. On arrival, I was briefed by Sgt Kahler.

I walked through the scene and observed a farm type truck with extensive damage on the west side of the tracks. There was a large farm box that had separated from the truck as a result of the collision. There was a large amount of potatoes on the ground located all around the box over to 92 Av NW to the north. The train was stopped and had been separated by railroad personnel to allow medical personnel to attend to the injured occupants of the truck.

**Collision Description:** This collision occurred at a private railroad crossing on 92 Av NW at MP 58.9 of the BNSF main line. The DOT crossing number for the crossing is 84722N.

**Pre-Impact:** The train was traveling southbound on the BNSF main line approaching a private railroad crossing at 92 Av NW. The truck (driven by Jesus Torres-Aranda) was traveling on 92 Av NW in a southeast direction approaching the railroad crossing.

**Impact:** The train struck the truck just behind the cab on the drivers side as it crossed the tracks at the railroad crossing.

**Post-Impact:** The train continued south until the conductor was able to bring it to a stop. The truck was thrown to a grassy area to the southwest of the impact area facing westbound. The box on the truck that was loaded with potatoes separated from the vehicle and came to rest just to the southwest of the impact area spilling the load of potatoes.

**Investigation:**

I asked Det Goffin to take pictures of the scene. I saw that the train was separated at a driveway located at 32110 Pioneer Highway. The engines with multiple cars was located to the south of the driveway and the rest was located to the north of the driveway. I was informed that BNSF personnel ( Division Train Master: Elgin S. Hawkins 425-212-8744 ) separated the train and moved it to allow medical personnel to provide aid to the injured occupants of the truck.

I used my engineer roller wheel to measure the length of the front part of the train from the back of the last box car to the front engine. The length of that part of the train was 1195.5 feet. Det Goffin walked with me and took pictures of the damage to the lead locomotive engine (BNSF#2620) of the train. There were three locomotive engines for the train. There was significant damage to the right front side of the engine and down the right side of the engine as well. Damage included multiple broken air line fittings, a broken fuel filler cap, dented fuel tanks and broken and bent railings down the right side of the engine. Det Goffin documented the damage with pictures. He also returned to the scene on 09-28-16 and took daytime photos.

came to rest approx 16 feet southwest of the point of impact. Taylor was located between the box and cab of the truck approx 52 feet from the point of impact.

Witness Glen Nash said he and his wife Nancy were driving northbound on Pioneer Highway and looked to the west and he saw Torres-Aranda approaching the railroad crossing in the potato truck. He said the truck drove right onto the center of the tracks and was hit by the train. He said the truck flew into the air and then he lost sight of the truck as the train passed by. He said he stopped approx 1/4 mile down the road and called 9-1-1 and then went back to the scene. He said he provided aid to Taylor. He said he saw Torres-Aranda still in the cab of the truck.

Witness Cassidy Sorenson said he driving southbound on Pioneer Highway and was slowly overtaking the BNSF train. He said just as he was passing the train, he heard the trains horn blowing (one long, two short, one long and then a constant horn). He said he saw a red truck (Torres-Aranda) approaching the private railroad crossing at a 45 degree angle . He said Torres-Aranda did not stop and the train hit the truck just behind the cab.

Investigators (Chelsea Warneke and Lauren Alvarez) from the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene to conduct their preliminary investigation. They took pictures and obtained information from me in reference to the train. Torres-Aranda's son, Jesus Torres-Velazquez (4b) was on scene. The ME investigators contacted Torres-Velazquez and turned over his fathers personal property to him. They took custody of Torres-Aranda's body and transported him to the medical examiner's office. The ME case number is 16SN1732.

09-28-16- I contacted Providence Hospital to check on the status of Taylor and was informed that he had been transferred to Harborview Medical Center for treatment of his injuries. I contacted Harborview Medical Center, Taylor was in surgery and would not be available for an interview for several days.


10-06-16- I was contacted Andrew Day (BNSF), Senior Claims Representative. He was requesting information on Taylor. He also stated that there was video from the train and he would make that available next week if I wanted to view it. (scheduled for 10-11-16 at 1230 hrs).

10-07-16- I responded to Harborview Medical Center and contacted Taylor on the trauma ward and obtained a statement from him. Taylor said Jesus Torres-Aranda was driving the truck from the fields (he said they had made approx 15 loads from that field that day) located to the west of the tracks. He said they were approaching the tracks at 5-10 mph. He said Torres-Aranda never stopped and never looked back to see if a train was coming. Taylor said he looked across into the drivers side outside mirror and saw the lights of the train approaching their location. He said he opened the door of the truck and jumped. He said he remembered waking up and people were around him helping him. He said he did not remember hearing any whistles from the train. Based on the location of Taylor post collision (52 feet from impact), I think he decided he wanted to jump from the truck and started to open the door but the train struck the truck first and he was then ejected from the truck.

10-11-16- Day came to my office to let me view the video from engine BNSF2620. I watched the video which showed Torres-Aranda approaching the train crossing from the northwest at a slow speed (consistent with 5-10 mph reported by Taylor). The video confirms that Torres-Aranda never stopped at the posted stop sign/railroad crossing signs before starting over the tracks. I could hear the train whistle which was required by signal boards located on the side of the tracks prior to railroad crossings. I could hear the escape of air from the engine just prior to the collision which is consistent with the train being placed in emergency status. I then heard the brakes on the train engage just after the collision. Day told me the maximum speed for the train on the tracks in that area is 60 mph. He told me the train was already slowing down prior to the collision because it was due to go on a side track prior to Stan wood to allow another train to pass. Per BNSF policy, they do not make copies of the video, however, the copy of the video is secured by BNSF if further litigation is necessary.

11-14-16- I received a copy of the autopsy results on Torres-Aranda. The autopsy revealed multiple blunt force injuries to the torso, head and extremities for Torres-Aranda. His toxicology results were all negative for drugs and alcohol.

Weather: The weather at the time of the collision was clear with a temperature around 60 degrees.

Roadway Description: The BNSF tracks run generally from north to south in the area of the collision. The tracks are marked with the standard railroad signage.

92 Av NW is a private gravel road which runs from northwest to southeast in the area of the collision as it approaches the private railroad crossing just to the west of Pioneer Highway. The road runs at an approx 45 degree angle as it approaches the railroad crossing. The railroad crossing has a posted stop sign (approx 44 feet from the tracks) and a railroad crossing sign (approx 34 feet from the tracks).

Causation/Conclusion: The cause of this collision is Torres-Aranda failed to stop at the posted stop sign and railroad crossing sign at 92 Av NW and DOT crossing 84722N. He failed to yield to the train and was struck by the southbound BNSF train.
