- On March 9, 2018, Cameron Brewer d/b/a Reliance Moving (Cameron Brewer or Applicant) filed an application with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) for authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington (Application). Mr. Brewer signed the Application and included with it a business license number, USDOT number, registration with the Department of Labor and Industries, registration with the Employment Security Department, and an insurance filing.
- On March 20, 2018, the Commission issued a Notice of Intent to Deny Application for Permanent Authority and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (Notice). The Commission alleged in the Notice that Mr. Brewer pled guilty to Petty Theft on August 1, 2017. The Notice provided Mr. Brewer with the opportunity to request a hearing to contest the factual allegations by April 9, 2018.
- On April 5, 2018, Mr. Cameron filed with the Commission a Request for Hearing.
- Pursuant to RCW 34.05.482 and WAC 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for determining whether Cameron Brewer's application for permanent authority should be denied due to the concerns raised after Staff's review and investigation of the application.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that it will hold a brief adjudicative proceeding in this matter at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, May 15, 2018, in Room 206, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The record in this case will consist of any documents regarding the matter that are considered by or prepared for the presiding officer for the brief adjudicative proceeding

and a transcript of any oral statements given at the hearing, which statements will be given under oath.

- Written notice of any other stage in the proceeding or other formal proceedings that the Commission may deem appropriate will be given during the course of this case. The Commission will provide at its offices in Olympia, Washington, copies of documents in the current record for use by the parties or others who may want to review them.
- Parties wishing to submit any other documents for consideration at the brief adjudicative proceeding must file with the Commission a list enumerating and describing any such documents **no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, May 11, 2018**, and bring an original and three (3) copies of those documents to the hearing. Filing shall be in accordance with WAC 480-07-140.
- 9 THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the brief adjudicative proceeding set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
