Commission Authority

Certification

An authorized officer, partner or owner must sign the Annual Report Certification. Unsigned reports are considered incomplete and may be subject to penalties.

Regulatory Fees

Regulatory fees are set by UTC order A-140166.

Deadlines

All water companies regulated by the UTC are required to complete this form. Failure to properly complete all schedules will result in the report being considered incomplete. A completed report AND regulatory fee payment must be received by the UTC no later than May 1. **Please note**, if May 1 falls on a weekend, unless you are filing your report and making your payment electronically, you **must** make sure your report and payment reaches the UTC offices the business day **before** May 1.

Late Fees and Interest

Companies who don't pay their regulatory fee by the deadline will owe a late fee and could owe interest.

After May 1: 2% late fee on balance due.

After May 31: 2% late fee on balance due and 1% interest fee for each month after May 31.

Penalties

You will owe a penalty if you don't file a complete annual report and pay your company's regulatory fee by the May 1 deadline, this is in addition to any late fees. Late fees and penalties are **not** the same thing.

The following penalties apply for filing and paying late:

1 to 30 days late = \$250 penalty

31 to 60 days late = \$500 penalty

61 to 90 days late = \$1,000 penalty

Extension Requests

You may file a written request for an extension to file the completed annual report; however, **the UTC will not extend the deadline for paying your regulatory fee**. Notify the company of the commission's decision.
