- PROCEDURAL HISTORY. Docket UT-073033 involves Qwest Corporation's (Qwest) request for approval of additions to its non-impaired wire center list. The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this matter at Olympia, Washington, on July 31, 2007, before Administrative Law Judge Patricia Clark. At the prehearing conference, the parties concurred that this matter should be considered after a final decision in UT-073035. By Order 05, entered March 21, 2008, the Commission accepted, subject to conditions, the multi-party settlement filed in UT-073035. By Order 06, entered in this proceeding on March 21, 2008, the Commission scheduled a prehearing conference to convene April 17, 2008.
- No party filed a petition for review of Order 05 in UT-073035 and that order became final, by operation of law, on April 11, 2008. On April 17, 2008, the Commission entered a Notice of Finality. The prehearing conference convened, as scheduled, on April 17, 2008, at Olympia, Washington, before Administrative Law Judge Patricia Clark.

- According to Order 05, entered March 21, 2008, future petitions to designate wire centers as non-impaired must include business line calculations according to the methodology established in UT-053025.³ During the prehearing conference, Qwest indicated that it could make that supplemental filing by April 21, 2008, and that deadline was adopted without objection. Other parties to this proceeding were permitted to file objections to the wire center designations by May 21, 2008. No party filed an objection by the deadline.
- Accordingly, pursuant to the provisions of the previously-approved settlement agreement, the parties filed a joint request for an expedited order designating as non-impaired the facilities identified in the Qwest filing.
- The Commission finds and concludes that Qwest's request for approval of additions to its non-impaired wire center list should be approved as follows:
