BNSF Railway Petition to Close Hickox Road At-Grade Rail Crossing

Dear Ms. Washburn:

The purpose of this letter is to give official comment to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission on the proposed closure of the Hickox Road rail crossing in south Mount Vernon. The Board of Skagit County Commissioners is opposed to the closure of the Hickox Road rail crossing for the following reasons:

- The Hickox rail crossing provides safety and economic benefits to residents and businesses in the south Mount Vernon area. The closure would affect emergency response negatively.
- Interstate 5 from Conway to Cook Road is being studied to determine improvements to interchanges. A full interchange at Hickox Road is an obvious improvement to the infrastructure and would provide economic development opportunity to the south Mount Vernon commercial zone. Closure of the Hickox Road rail crossing would stifle this opportunity and preclude BNSF participation in future infrastructure improvements. Cost to taxpayers would be increased.
- There are no other public rail crossings in Mount Vernon's Urban Growth Area (UGA) south of Blackburn Road so the availability of this crossing is crucial to safety and economic development.

• The Hickox rail crossing is a vital crossing to the agricultural community south of Mount Vernon in that it provides direct route to transport agricultural products to the urbanized areas for processing and marketing.

In summary, this proposed closure would reduce access to all of Mount Vernon's southern UGA, reduce response time for emergency vehicles, limit options for the existing transportation grid and increase taxpayer costs in the future, and limit Mount Vernon's ability to attract commercial development.

The plan to close the Hickox Road crossing appears to be poorly conceived and did not take into consideration some much better alternatives. One of the best alternatives is to put in the second rail and construct a crossing such as the one at Blackburn. Citizen safety would be preserved, emergency services would not be negatively impacted, vehicle access would be preserved, and Mount Vernon's commercial development opportunities would be enhanced. One of the most important considerations is that it would not limit future options for the transportation grid. True, this option would be more expensive than merely closing the crossing; however, the investment would pay off handsomely in the future.

Skagit County does not support petition TR-070696 and requests that a hearing be scheduled.

Attached is a copy of Resolution No.R20060256 signed by the Board of Skagit County Commissioners on July 31, 2006 in opposition to the proposed closure of Hickox Road BNSF rail crossing.

Thank you for your consideration of these comments and request for a public hearing.
