Dear Mr. Gomez,

As chairman of the Kingston Chamber's passenger ferry committee, I am writing to express both the committees' and the Chamber's support for Aqua Express to be granted the renewal of the rights certificate for the Kingston - Seattle passenger ferry route.

Included is a copy of "Kingston's Quest for a Fast-foot Ferry". Items 1, 2, 8, 9, 12 and 17 are examples showing the wide community support for this service. This document also indicates the stages our community has experienced - "highs" and "lows".

Because of our ten-year experience we understand that a joint effort by Aqua Express, Kitsap Transit, and the Port of Kingston is the way this route should be operated. By having these three entities working together Kingston then has a docking facility and the upland parking in place. Losing either the docking space or the parking would just create a future huge expense. Going through the permitting process again would be arduous.

We strongly support Aqua Express and Kitsap Transit's efforts: Aqua Express with the support of the Port of Kingston and Kitsap Transit is the obvious and best choice for the route.

I would like to request time to speak at the June 14 prehearing.
