- On January 22, 2009, BNSF Railway Company (BNSF) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition for the closure of the Logen Road grade crossing. The complete file in this matter sets forth the issues in more detail and is available for public inspection at the Commission's offices in the Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington, and on the Commission's web site at www.utc.wa.gov/090121.
- A prehearing conference in this matter is being held pursuant to Part IV of the Administrative Procedure Act, RCW 34.05, pertaining to adjudicative proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 81 RCW, including RCW 81.04.110 and RCW 81.44.010, with specific legal authority to regulate the closure of railroad crossings pursuant to RCW 81.53, including without limitation, RCW 81.53.060. In addition to the foregoing statutes, rules involved include those within WAC 480-07 relating to practice and procedure. The ultimate issue involved is whether public safety requires an order be entered authorizing closure of the above-described crossing.
- The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter on shortened notice. See  $WAC\ 480-07-440(1)(a)$ .

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That a prehearing conference in this matter will be held at 1:30 p.m., on February 13, 2009, in Room 206, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington. The Commission prefers, and strongly recommends that parties appear in person. However, if this imposes a hardship, parties may attend the prehearing conference via the Commission's teleconference bridge (360-664-3846). If you appear via the teleconference, you must place your call five minutes before the time that the conference is scheduled to begin. *Note*: There is limited space for participation on the bridge line and space cannot be reserved.

- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider petitions to intervene, establish dates for filing and distribution of evidence and workpapers and other scheduling matters, determine the specific issues in the proceeding and other matters to aid in its disposition, as specified in WAC 480-07-430.
- Petitions to intervene should be made in writing at least three business days prior to the date scheduled for the prehearing conference, as required in WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider petitions to intervene made orally during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. In addition, party representatives must file notices of appearance with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day prior to the conference. If any party or witness needs an interpreter or other assistance, please fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The time and place for any evidentiary hearings will be set at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default in accordance with RCW 34.05.440. The Commission specifically invokes the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 which allow the Commission to seek penalties for a party in default.
