- On December 30, 2011, Waste Management of Washington, Inc. (Waste Management), filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for an extension of authority under Certificate G-237, standing in the name of Waste Management of Washington, Inc., d/b/a WM Healthcare Solutions of Washington, for authority to provide solid waste collection service consisting of bio-hazardous waste in the state of Washington. Notice of the Application was published in the Commission's weekly Docket on February 7, 2012.
- STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under RCW Title 81, and has legal authority to regulate persons seeking to furnish solid waste collection services under RCW 81.77 and WAC 480-70. The statutes that apply to this matter include RCW 80.01, RCW 81.04, RCW 81.28, and RCW 81.77, including but not limited to RCW 80.01.040, RCW 81.04.020, and RCW 81.77.040.
- The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.
- The issues in this proceeding include whether the existing solid waste collection companies serving the territories sought in the application of Waste Management will not provide service to the satisfaction to the Commission and whether the issuance of

an amended certificate to Waste Management for the service it proposes is necessary and is otherwise consistent with the public interest, and whether other carriers are authorized to serve in the territory requested.

- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That it will hold a prehearing conference in this matter at 1:30 p.m., on April 10, 2012, in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence and workpapers, to identify the issues in the proceeding and determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430. In addition, the Commission will consider whether it would be an efficient use of Commission and party time and resources to consolidate this matter with Docket TG-112025.¹
- INTERVENTION: Persons who wish to intervene should file a petition to intervene in writing at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a). The Commission will consider oral petitions to intervene during the conference, but strongly prefers written petitions to intervene. Party representatives must file a notice of appearance with the Commission no later than the business day before the conference. See WAC 480-07-345(2). Any party or witness in need of an interpreter or other assistance should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission. The Commission will set the time and place for any evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference, on the record of a later conference or hearing session, or by later written notice.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
