My name is Laura Chartoff. I'm an 8 administrative law judge with the Washington Utilities 9 and Transportation Commission. I am the presiding officer for today's hearing being conducted at the 10 11 Commission's headquarters in Olympia. 12 Today is Wednesday, April 11th, 2018, and 13 the time is approximately 9:00 a.m. Today's hearing 14 involves a total of three household goods carriers, so the first thing we'll do is take a roll call to 15 16 determine which companies are present. As you can see, 17 there's a court reporter creating a record of today's proceedings, so when I call your name, please raise your 18 19 hand to identify yourself and also give a verbal response to the roll call like "here" or "present." 20 So the first docket is TV-180206, Warren 21 22 Harris, doing business as Done Right Moving and Labor. 23 MR. HARRIS: Present. 24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. 25 TV-180207, Emmanuel Samuels and Alex

Page 4 Samuels, doing business as Samuels Brothers, LLC. 1 2 MR. SAMUELS: Present. JUDGE CHARTOFF: 3 Thank you. And TV-180214, Dmitriy Satir, doing business 4 as Pacific North -- PNW Moving and Delivery LLC. 5 MR. SATIR: 6 Here. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. 8 Okay. So each of you are here because the 9 Commission filed a complaint alleging that each of your companies is performing or advertising to perform work 10 as a household goods carrier without the required 11 12 permit. The purpose of today's proceeding is to formally explain what your choices are and then hear 13 from each of you regarding which option you wish to 14 15 pursue. 16 You can choose one of two options on behalf of your company. The first option is to cease and 17 desist providing, offering, or advertising unpermitted 18 household goods services. So if you choose this option, 19 you will need to demonstrate what you have done to shut 20 down your business either completely or partially to 21

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example, you will need to provide proof that you have

avoid further enforcement action by the Commission.

you are no longer performing unlawful services.

Commission is going to want to see sufficient proof that

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- 1 taken down or changed your website or other online
- 2 advertisements for your business.
- The second option is to ask for a formal
- 4 classification hearing to show why you don't need a
- 5 permit. If you choose this option, you are contesting
- 6 the allegations in the complaint and claim not to be
- 7 conducting household goods moving services. For this
- 8 option, we will schedule a formal hearing for a date in
- 9 the near future with a deadline two to three weeks from
- 10 now for both your company and Commission Staff to
- 11 declare all witnesses and file exhibits.
- So each of you has a right to be heard by
- 13 the Commission, and I will call you up to do that
- 14 individually. Commission Staff also has a right to be
- 15 heard and Mr. Brian Braun will be representing the
- 16 Commission this morning. If you have not already met
- 17 Mr. Braun, he is seated at the table to my right, and he
- 18 is a Commission compliance investigator.
- In a few minutes, I'll call each of your
- 20 companies forward to make your choice on how to proceed.
- 21 At that time, I will swear you in so that anything you
- 22 tell the Court will be under oath and can be considered
- 23 sworn testimony. Once you are sworn in, I will ask if
- 24 you understand your options for today's hearing and then
- 25 ask you to state your preference. If there's anything

- 1 else you want to explain to me, you can do so at this
- 2 time.
- In each of the complaints, Commission Staff
- 4 is also seeking to have a penalty imposed. The law sets
- 5 the maximum penalty for each violation at \$5,000. Staff
- 6 will be making a penalty recommendation as part of any
- 7 agreed order. Mr. Braun will be explaining that
- 8 recommendation, but the Commission will be making the
- 9 final decision about the amount of the penalty to be
- 10 imposed.
- If you choose to testify about how you are
- 12 getting out of the household goods business, I will
- 13 allow you to make a statement explaining how you plan to
- 14 do that. Depending on what proof you can provide, you
- 15 should be able to reach an agreed order resolving this
- 16 matter with Commission Staff, and you can speak to
- 17 Mr. Braun about that during the recess.
- 18 Finally, if you choose to contest the
- 19 allegations in the complaint, we will schedule another
- 20 hearing for the Commission to present the necessary
- 21 evidence to prove its case. If we're going to set a
- 22 hearing, it will help if you know your schedule for the
- 23 next month or two so when we review calendars.
- So after I hear from each of your companies,
- 25 we will take a break to provide Commission Staff time to

- 1 meet with each of you and prepare a final disposition
- 2 for your case.
- 3 Mr. Braun, I will swear you in at this point
- 4 so you are sworn in for the entire proceeding.
- 5 (Brian Braun sworn.)
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
- 7 Okay. So I will call the companies up one
- 8 by one. So the first is Warren Harris, doing business
- 9 as Done Right Moving and Labor.
- 10 Will you please step forward and take a
- 11 seat. Oh, I can swear you in.
- 12 (Warren Harris sworn.)
- 13 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. Is that on?
- 14 MR. HARRIS: I believe so.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Can you please state
- 16 your first and last name for the record and spell your
- 17 last name for the court reporter?
- MR. HARRIS: Warren Harris, H-a-r-r-i-s,
- 19 Harris.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And what is your
- 21 relationship to the company?
- MR. HARRIS: I'm the owner.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: And how do you want to
- 24 proceed this morning?
- 25 MR. HARRIS: I would like to proceed -- I

- 1 would like to apply for the proper permit -- oh, here it
- 2 goes. But I have -- I have ceased to all my operations,
- 3 I've taken off all my ads, I've got my websites down,
- 4 everything's been dissolved. So I haven't been
- 5 practicing moving or household goods, so I'm looking to
- 6 apply to get the proper permit is what I'm trying to get
- 7 at.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So, Mr. Braun, have
- 9 you had a chance to verify those efforts?
- 10 MR. BRAUN: Yes, Judge, and yes, he is
- 11 correct. His website is down, Facebook has been
- 12 scrubbed, ads where I found have been removed.
- 13 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So -- so
- 14 we'll go ahead and pursue a cease and desist order.
- MR. HARRIS: Okay.
- 16 JUDGE CHARTOFF: So when we take a recess,
- 17 you will have the opportunity to speak with Staff and
- 18 see if you agree on an order for entry. Essentially
- 19 that order will say that you agree you were operating
- 20 without a permit, that you advertised without a permit,
- 21 and that you agree to stop operating until you get a
- 22 permit.
- MR. HARRIS: Yes, ma'am.
- 24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And once you are satisfied
- 25 that you understand all the terms of the order, you and

- 1 Mr. Braun will both sign it. It will also include most
- 2 likely an agreement about the penalty to be imposed, but
- 3 if not, you can make your case about why the penalty
- 4 should be different than what Staff is recommending.
- 5 MR. HARRIS: Okay.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Are there any other
- 7 questions about this case?
- 8 MR. HARRIS: Not from me.
- 9 MR. BRAUN: None from me, Your Honor.
- 10 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Please return to
- 11 your seat and wait to speak with Staff at the recess.
- MR. HARRIS: Thank you, ma'am.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
- Okay. So I will call the next case.

SATIR: Last name is S-a-t-i-r. 13 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And your relationship to 14 the company? 15 MR. SATIR: Owner. 16 JUDGE CHARTOFF: So how do you want to 17 proceed this morning? MR. SATIR: So I want to kind of get a 18 19 second thought on how to do it, because there's no third option kind of -- so I did have insurance for that time, 20 and I have proof of -- copies of the proof. So I need 21 22 to -- I didn't file it correctly because kind of just happened that my wedding was -- and I was first year 23

marriage. So I didn't file it, and I moved away from my

parents, but all the mail was going there. And I was --

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- 1 I did get the letter that I needed to update the
- 2 information for insurance, but I did not act on it, and
- 3 that's my fault for that.
- 4 So I want to see how I can get reinstated
- 5 and I have new insurance, a certification of liability
- 6 for the next six months already with me right here. And
- 7 then I do also want to take the course on transportation
- 8 training that is happening in Cheney, Washington, this
- 9 upcoming Monday so next time I'm completely with
- 10 everything I know up-to-date, so the training for
- 11 household movers.
- 12 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So are -- you
- 13 applied for a permit previously?
- 14 MR. SATIR: Yes, I just didn't file the
- 15 new -- I believe September, I didn't file the new
- 16 insurance.
- 17 MR. BRAUN: Yeah, Judge, he was previously
- 18 permitted and then the permit was revoked due to lack of
- 19 insurance.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And have you had a
- 21 chance to verify his insurance?
- MR. BRAUN: No, I have not, Judge.
- 23 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So what would be --
- 24 if he wants to get his permit back, would he have to
- 25 reapply, is that how that works?

- 1 MR. BRAUN: That's my understanding. He can
- 2 talk with licensing with the new insurance verification
- 3 to get his permit reinstalled. I think there's an
- 4 application for that as well.
- 5 JUDGE CHARTOFF: So yeah, I quess your
- 6 option if you want to get your permit reinstated, you
- 7 would need to agree to cease and desist your business
- 8 activities until you get your permit.
- 9 MR. SATIR: I've already kind of paid for
- 10 the next six months of insurance, and it's not cheap for
- 11 us to get insurance. So is there any other option I can
- 12 take?
- 13 MR. BRAUN: Judge, if I may.
- 14 The application process is pretty quick to
- 15 turn around. I can show you. We can talk with
- 16 licensing to help you get that done very quickly.
- 17 MR. SATIR: Okay. And I did not stop doing
- 18 the advertisement because as you know, search engine, it
- 19 takes a while to build up, and if I took it down, it
- 20 would take me about the same amount of time to get all
- 21 the information up. And do I have to still cease and
- 22 desist, take down the website as well even if it's quick
- 23 or...
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yes, yeah, if you choose
- 25 the cease -- if you agree to cease and desist, you do

- 1 have to take down your advertising.
- 2 MR. SATIR: But I'm not necessarily -- I am
- 3 left with no option here. I only have two options kind
- 4 of thing, and none of them help me kind of to get past
- 5 this. I understand that I didn't file it correctly, but
- 6 I have insurance and everything there in place.
- 7 MR. BRAUN: Judge, if I may.
- 8 Instead of -- an option that the Commission
- 9 would be comfortable with is instead of actually taking
- 10 everything down but modifying your website to say --
- 11 because there are things you can do that are, say, labor
- 12 only. It's the part of the truck driving over the
- 13 public roads that the Commission then steps in and
- 14 modifies and covers. But there are things you can do to
- 15 your website to change it --
- MR. SATIR: I can do that.
- 17 MR. BRAUN: You don't have to take down the
- 18 whole website, but there are ways that we do not
- 19 regulate that we can talk with to help your advertising.
- 20 MR. SATIR: Okay. That is the better
- 21 option.
- MR. BRAUN: If that's acceptable with the
- 23 judge.
- 24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: I -- yes, yeah. So it
- 25 sounds like -- what I'm going to suggest is at the

- 1 recess that you meet with Staff and see if you can get a
- 2 cease and desist order that you can both agree on.
- 3 MR. SATIR: Okay.
- 4 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Do you think that's
- 5 workable?
- 6 MR. BRAUN: Absolutely, Judge.
- 7 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And then I will --
- 8 after the recess, if you're not able to agree, then I --
- 9 you know, we can -- I will call you all back up after
- 10 the recess and we can deal with it at that time.
- MR. SATIR: Okay.
- 12 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So you can return to
- 13 your seat.
- Okay. So at this point, we're going to take
- 15 a recess, and as soon as you have the chance to review
- 16 the cease and desist orders and language with Staff,
- 17 there will be some negotiation about the penalty. It
- 18 may be nominal depending on the history of your company
- 19 or there may be a reason that Staff asked for a larger
- 20 penalty, for example, if you have appeared here before
- 21 or previously held a permit with the Commission.
- 22 Typically a portion of the penalty is
- 23 suspended, which is meant to deter you from future
- 24 illegal operations. So you pay a portion today and the
- 25 remaining portion of the penalty does not become payable

- 1 until -- unless you violate the order. So we will call
- 2 each of you back up and make sure you understand the
- 3 order, I will sign it on the record today, and then you
- 4 will leave with a copy of it.
- 5 Anything else before we take a break?
- 6 MR. BRAUN: No, Judge. Thank you.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. We are in recess.
- 8 (Recess from 9:21 a.m. to 10:31 a.m.)
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So we will be back
- 10 on the record. I understand that the cease and desist
- 11 orders have been explained and presented to each
- 12 company, so I will call you back up one at a time in the
- 13 order we went before.
- Warren Harris.
- So, Mr. Harris, have you had a chance to
- 16 walk through the order?
- 17 MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 18 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand all
- 19 of the pages prior to the signature page?
- MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 21 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And I see that you
- 22 and Mr. Braun have both signed it.
- 23 It looks like Staff -- let's see. Okay. It
- 24 looks like you have recommended two violations in this
- 25 case, one for offering a move and one for advertising?

Page 18 1 MR. BRAUN: Yes, Your Honor. 2 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And a \$5,000 penalty will 3 be imposed, a \$4,500 portion of the penalty will be suspended for two years and then waived provided the 4 business refrains permanently from operating as a 5 6 household goods carrier without first obtaining the permit. 8 MR. HARRIS: Yes. 9 JUDGE CHARTOFF: The remainder of the penalty is due and payable. Is there -- oh, according 10 to the -- oh, it looks like \$100 is due today and \$400 11 12 is due in approximately a month? 13 MR. HARRIS: Yes. 14 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So the suspension -and for the record, you're agreeing to shut down 15 16 until -- unless or until you get a permit? 17 MR. HARRIS: Yes. JUDGE CHARTOFF: The suspension period is 18 19 for two years; is that right, from today's date? 20 MR. BRAUN: Correct, Your Honor. JUDGE CHARTOFF: That means that if Staff 21 22 finds an advertisement or you offer a move during that time, the remaining \$4,500 penalty becomes immediately 23 24 due; do you understand that? 25 MR. HARRIS: Yes, ma'am.

- 1 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And the order to
- 2 cease and desist is permanent, meaning it does not
- 3 expire. So even after the two-year period of the
- 4 suspended penalty has run, if Staff discovers you're
- 5 still operating, Staff can go straight to superior court
- 6 and seek enforcement of this order, which will include
- 7 significant additional penalties. So there's strong
- 8 incentive for you to comply with the law.
- 9 MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 10 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And with regard to the
- 11 payment schedule, do you understand that if you miss a
- 12 payment, the entire amount including the \$4,500 penalty
- will be due and payable immediately?
- MR. HARRIS: Yes, I do.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: So if for some reason
- 16 you're going to be late making a payment, you need to
- 17 contact Staff and make arrangements, and failing to
- 18 contact them will ensure that the entire penalty will be
- 19 imposed.
- MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 21 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And you understand
- 22 legally what you can and can't do?
- MR. HARRIS: Yes.
- 24 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And remember that
- 25 Commission Staff is always available to assist you if

- 1 you have any questions. The Commission's goal is
- 2 compliance.
- 3 Okay. So if -- are there any additional
- 4 questions about the order?
- 5 MR. HARRIS: No, ma'am.
- 6 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. I will sign it.
- 7 Okay. So thank you. We'll hand that down.
- And at this point, do you get him a copy?
- 9 Oh, okay. You'll get a copy and leave with
- 10 that today. Thank you.
- MR. HARRIS: Thank you, ma'am.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So next is Emmanuel
- 13 Samuels.
- Okay. So did you have a chance to walk
- 15 through the order?
- MR. SAMUELS: Yes.
- 17 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand the
- 18 terms of the order?
- MR. SAMUELS: Yes.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And I see that you
- 21 both signed it. So looks like a \$5,000 penalty will be
- imposed, 4,500 of it is suspended for two years and then
- 23 waived on the condition that the company honors its
- 24 pledge of future compliance by permanently staying out
- of the industry without first obtaining a permit from

- 1 the Commission.
- 2 MR. SAMUELS: Yes.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. And I'll --
- 4 again, I'll repeat a little of what I said earlier that
- 5 if the Staff -- that the suspension period is two years.
- 6 And if the Staff finds that an advertisement or an offer
- 7 to move during that time, the remaining \$4,500 will
- 8 become immediately due and that the order to cease and
- 9 desist is permanent, meaning it does not expire. So
- 10 even after the two-year period has run, if Staff
- 11 discovers you operating without a permit, they can go
- 12 straight to superior court and seek enforcement of this
- 13 order, which will include significant additional
- 14 penalties; do you understand that?
- 15 MR. SAMUELS: I understand.
- 16 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And it looks like
- 17 Staff has found -- recommended two violations, one for
- 18 offering a move and one for advertising a move. Okay.
- 19 And is there -- and there's a payment plan with \$100 due
- 20 today and \$200 due May 30th and 200 due June 30th.
- MR. SAMUELS: Yes.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: And, again, I want you to
- 23 understand that if you miss a payment, the entire amount
- including the 4,500 penalty will be due and payable
- 25 immediately. So if for some reason you're going to be

- 1 late making a payment, you should contact Staff and make
- 2 arrangements.
- 3 MR. SAMUELS: Understood.
- 4 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And you understand
- 5 legally what you can and can't do?
- MR. SAMUELS: Yeah.
- 7 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And remember that
- 8 Commission Staff is available to assist you if you have
- 9 any questions.
- 10 Okay. So I will go ahead and sign this one.
- 11 Okay. So they -- yep, they will give you a copy. Thank
- 12 you.
- Okay. And the last is Dmitriy Satir.
- Okay. And did you have a chance to walk
- 15 through the order?
- MR. SATIR: Yes.
- 17 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand all
- 18 the pages before the signature page?
- MR. SATIR: Yes.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And I see that you and
- 21 Mr. Braun have both signed it.
- MR. SATIR: Yes.
- 23 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And for the record, it --
- 24 Mr. Braun, it looks like you have recommended two
- 25 violations in this case, one for offering a move and one

- 1 for advertising?
- 2 MR. BRAUN: That is correct, Judge.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: And a \$5,000 penalty will
- 4 be imposed, a \$3,500 portion of the penalty is suspended
- 5 for a period of two years and then waived if you refrain
- 6 permanently from further operations as a household goods
- 7 carrier without first obtaining the required permit from
- 8 the Commission.
- 9 MR. SATIR: Yes.
- JUDGE CHARTOFF: And for the record, you're
- 11 agreeing to shut down the household goods carrier
- 12 business unless or until you get a permit.
- 13 MR. SATIR: Reinstated, yes.
- 14 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Reinstated, right.
- 15 And the suspension period is for two years.
- 16 That means if Staff finds an advertisement or you offer
- 17 to move during that time, the remaining 3,500 becomes
- 18 immediately due; do you understand?
- MR. SATIR: Yes.
- 20 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And additionally,
- 21 the order to cease and desist is permanent, meaning it
- 22 does not expire. So if you do not get your permit
- 23 reinstated and Staff discovers you're still operating,
- 24 Staff can go straight to superior court and seek
- 25 enforcement of this order which will include significant

Page 24 additional penalties. 2 MR. SATIR: Yes. 3 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And you are 4 paying -- oh, okay. So you are going to pay \$1,000 on 5 April 30th? 6 MR. SATIR: Yes. JUDGE CHARTOFF: And \$500 on May 30th? 8 MR. SATIR: Yes. 9 JUDGE CHARTOFF: And you heard what I said, 10 right, about if you cannot make a payment, you need to contact Staff? 11 12 MR. SATIR: Yes. 13 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Or it will become -- the 14 entire amount will become immediately due and payable. 15 MR. SATIR: Okay. 16 JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Are there additional 17 questions about this order? 18 MR. SATIR: No. 19 JUDGE CHARTOFF: No, okay. Then I will sign 20 You're free to go once you get a copy. Okay. 21 MR.
