TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On June 1, 2018, Avista Corporation (Avista), Pacific Power & Light Company (Pacific Power), and Puget Sound Energy (PSE) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) reports concerning progress in meeting conservation targets during the preceding biennium and reports detailing the eligible renewable resources acquired for complying with the 2018 renewable resource targets.

These reports are required by the Energy Independence Act, Chapter 19.285 RCW and WAC 480-109. WAC 480-109-040(2) and WAC 480-109-210(3) provide that Commission Staff and all interested persons may comment on these reports within at least 30 days of the utility's filing.

The Commission will consider the reports and any comments it has received at its regularly scheduled open meeting, on **Thursday, August 9, 2018, at 9:30 a.m.** The meeting will be held at the Commission's Headquarters, Room 206, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT AND NOTICE OF OPEN MEETING

The Commission will consider all comments and determine whether additional scrutiny is warranted, and may establish an adjudicative proceeding or other process to fully consider appropriate revisions. Upon conclusion of its review of the conservation reports, the Commission will determine whether the Companies have acquired enough conservation resources to achieve compliance with their 2016-2017 biennial conservation targets. For the renewable resource standard reports the Commission will issue a decision determining whether the Companies correctly calculated their 2018 renewable resource targets and complied with their reporting requirements.
