NOTICE OF PETITION FOR DECLARATORY ORDER

And

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND TO PETITION

(By Monday, May 10, 2021, at 5 p.m.)

RE: *In the Matter of the Petition of City of Spokane for an Order Declaring that the City of Spokane Waste to Energy Facility is not “Baseload Electric Generation” Under RCW 80.80.010(4) and WAC 480-100-405(2)(a), Docket UE-210247*

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On April 15, 2021, the City of Spokane (Spokane) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a Petition for Declaratory Order (Petition), which was assigned Docket UE-210247. Spokane requests that the Commission issue an order declaring that:

- The Spokane Waste to Energy (WTE) facility is not “baseload electric generation” under Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 80.80.010(4) and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-100-405(2), and
- Neither RCW 80.80.060(1) nor WAC 480-100-405(1) precludes Avista Utilities from entering into a 15-year contract for the WTE facility.

Pursuant to WAC 480-07-930, any interested person may file a response to the Petition within 20 days after the Petition is filed or at such other time as the Commission may establish by notice. Accordingly, the Commission establishes by this Notice a deadline of May 10, 2021, to respond to the Petition filed in Docket UE-210247.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That any interested persons may respond to the Petition by filing a written response with the Commission no later than Monday, May 10, 2021, at 5 p.m.
