MR. JOHNSON: Yeah, I had -- and I remember, I had the form from an old company.

JUDGE DOYLE: And then finally -- oh, I apologize, not finally, second-to-last. So WAC 480-15-555, failure to conduct or retain paperwork containing a criminal background check prior to hiring each employee. There was a \$400 penalty for four repeat violations.

MR. JOHNSON: Yeah, those -- so at the time, our -- like since I worked here, they've always done -they always do some program that they used to do the background check, and it was somebody else's job at a sister company.

So we've now taken that on here. It's done in office. So we're making sure that they're getting done rather than having someone else doing it, and if they, you know -- maybe they prioritize it different than us and it's on the back burner for them, I can make sure that it gets done.

Also the -- the company that they were using didn't always have clear results, and so we've stopped Edward made me aware that every time a person comes back, even if he, you know, leaves for a month and comes back, that a background check needs to be done every time. It wasn't -- it wasn't getting done.

And so he had in one of the times, or maybe even while he was working here, one of those times he had -- he had got this conviction of a crime, you know, and I didn't -- I didn't know about it. So as a result, I had someone working here who shouldn't have been.

So now we are doing all our background checks in house. Everything is done through Washington State Patrol, and I now know that, you know, if a guy leaves even for a week, I will make sure that each time he comes back and is hired that their background is ran. And then, again, we'll be pulling abstracts and things like that quarterly to -- to check so this doesn't happen again.

Because I believe I didn't -- yeah, I -- I don't know if I would get the same result if a guy was convicted of a crime here and is no longer eligible to work here, you know, and I just don't know about it. I don't know how that would turn out. So I'm going to have to have failsafes, which will be just looking up guys quarterly to make sure that everybody's in good standing so if I'm audited again or the next time, you
