- On March 22, 2004, in Docket No. TG-040553, Rubatino Refuse Removal, Inc. (Rubatino), filed an application (No. GA-079266) for extension of authority under Certificate No. G-58, for authority to provide solid waste collection service consisting of biomedical waste in Skagit, Whatcom, and Snohomish Counties. Notice of the Application was published in the Commission's weekly Docket of March 29, 2004.
- On April 19, 2004, the Commission entered Order No. 01, Order of Consolidation and Notice of Prehearing Conference in Docket Nos. TG-040221 and TG-040248, consolidating the applications of Harold LeMay (LeMay) Enterprises, Inc. and Kleen Environmental Technologies (Kleen Environmental) for hearing and determination due to the applicant's requests to serve overlapping territories.
- Application No. GA-079266 was removed from the Commission's weekly Docket on April 29, 2004, after a protest was filed by Stericycle, Inc. On May 3, 2004, the Commission issued a Notice to parties in Docket No. TG-040553, and Docket Nos. TG-040221 and TG-040248 (consolidated) for an opportunity to comment on consolidation of the three applications for hearing only. Commission Staff,

Rubatino, LeMay, the Washington Refuse and Recycling Association and Stericycle of Washington, Inc., filed responses in support of consolidation for hearing. Kleen Environmental filed a response opposing the consolidation.

- The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 81 RCW, which authorizes it to regulate persons seeking to furnish solid waste collection services under chapters 81.77 RCW and 480-70 WAC. The issues in the proceeding include 1) whether the existing solid waste collection company serving the territories sought in the application of Rubatino Refuse Removal, Inc. will not provide service to the satisfaction of the Commission, and 2) whether the issuance of an amended certificate to Rubatino Refuse Removal, Inc., for the services it proposes is necessary and is otherwise consistent with the public interest.
- In as much as the foregoing matters involve related principles of law and hearing the matters together would create a more efficient use of the Commission's and the parties' resources, it is appropriate that they be consolidated for hearing only pursuant to WAC 480-07-320.

ORDER OF CONSOLIDATION

THE COMMISSION ORDERS That these matters are consolidated for purposes of hearing. The Commission reserves the right to hold separate hearings and to enter separate orders in the individual dockets as it may deem appropriate.

- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default in accordance with RCW 34.05.440. The parties are further advised that the sanction provisions of WAC 480-07-450 are specifically invoked.
