In 2003, the legislature enacted statutory changes to improve the effectiveness of the GCPF program, to improve safety on and around railroads, and to encourage participation by railroads and road authorities. The proposed WUTC rules would be adopted to establish in rules the process for awarding grants through the Grade Crossing Protective Fund program. Reasons supporting proposal: The proposed rules to chapter 480-62 WAC will provide for a fair and open process for the review of applications for grants for a broad range of railroad safety improvements. The rules will support the statutory goals of increased public safety by encouraging diversity and openness.
