The purpose of this letter is to clarify my June 8, 2010 letter submitted on behalf of King County to these dockets. King County supports the extension of the current revenue sharing agreement, which allows Waste Management of Washington, Inc (WMW) to retain 30 percent of revenues from sale of recyclable materials, until such time as a new agreement is developed and agreed to by both parties, provided that this extension shall expire no later than September 30, 2010.

In my position as Solid Waste Division Director, I have been delegated the authority to make the certification of this plan as required in RCW 81.77.185. I hereby certify that the extended plan and revenue sharing agreement is consistent with the King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan.
