RE: Notification of Acceptance of Order Conditions Docket DG-180343, Bulldog Concrete Services, LLC

Dear Mr. Johnson:

On May 7, 2018, the Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) issued a \$1,000 Penalty Assessment in Docket DG-180343, against Bulldog Concrete Services, LLC for two violation(s) of RCW 19.122.030(2), for failing to request a dig ticket prior to performing an excavation. RCW 19.122.030(2) states, in part, that any excavator who fails to notify a one-number locator service and causes damage to a hazardous liquid or gas facility is subject to a civil penalty of not more than ten thousand dollars for each violation.

The Order offered Bulldog Concrete Services, LLC the ability to accept certain penalty conditions in lieu of the full penalty assessment.

On June 22, 2018, Bulldog Concrete Services, LLC submitted a signed confirmation accepting these conditions:

Admit that the violations occurred and enclose \$200 toward the payment of the penalty. I also accept the Commission's offer to suspend, and ultimately waive, the remaining \$800 penalty amount subject to the conditions that Bulldog Concrete's owner completes NUCA Dig Safe Training within six months of the issuance of this penalty assessment; submit documentation of that attendance to the Commission within five (5) days of attending the training; and commit no further violations of RCW 19.122 within the next 12-months.

This Notice of Acceptance of Order Conditions meets with Staff approval. Staff will apprise you regarding the compliance of these terms when they are met or if subsequent violations occur, at which time the penalty will be due immediately in full.
