- On January 13, 2020, Lake Union Ferry Company, LLC (Lake Union Ferry or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) an application for authority to operate as a commercial ferry in the state of Washington (Application). The Application lists David Stroble as Lake Union Ferry's owner.
- On January 2, 2024, the Commission issued a Notice of Intent to Cancel Commercial Ferry Certificate and Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (Notice) in this matter based on its review of annual reports. The Commission found that the Company generated no revenue in 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022. The Notice provided Lake Union Ferry the opportunity to request a hearing to contest the factual allegations by February 1, 2024.
- On January 29, 2024, Lake Union Ferry filed with the Commission a Request for Hearing.
- Pursuant to Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 34.05.482 and Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-07-610, the Commission determines that a brief adjudicative proceeding is appropriate for determining whether Lake Union Ferry's Certificate for operation as a commercial ferry should be cancelled.
