PREHEARING CONFERENCE: Pursuant to WAC 480-09-460, a continuation of the prehearing conference in the above referenced cases was held in Olympia on April 6, 1992, before Chairman Sharon L. Nelson, Commissioner Richard D. Casad, Commissioner A. J. Pardini, and Administrative Law Judge Christine Clishe of the Office of Administrative Hearings.

MOTION FOR CONSOLIDATION: The parties presented argument and comments on Cascade Natural Gas Company's motion to consolidate these matters. After consideration, the Commission granted the motion for consolidation. The Commission determined that the issues in the three cases are so intertwined as to require consolidation; that procedurally to do otherwise would be unworkable; and, that no harm to any party would result from consolidation. The Commission intends to act with dispatch in hearing and deciding the issues in the matter.

The Commission is aware of the concerns expressed by Mr. Finklea that the early prefiling date for his clients is prejudicial. The Commission does not believe these concerns are warranted. The Complainants should be prepared to go forward now with their cases in chief. The company filing was made in late January 1992 and has been available to the Complainants and Intervenors for months. The discovery rule was triggered on March 24, 1992. The parties could have served discovery requests then; if they had done so answers now would be due. The parties have emphasized their desire for a prompt resolution of this In order to complete this case within the statutory time frame, given the conflicts of the parties and the already scheduled cases of the Commission, it is necessary to follow the schedule set out above. Mr. Finklea's clients will have an opportunity at the rebuttal stage of the proceedings to address the testimony of other parties.

The parties have conferred to establish **DISCOVERY:** a discovery schedule. With the announcement of the hearing schedule, as listed above, it is anticipated that the parties

will confer further to set a schedule for discovery. In the event of disagreement, the parties may contact the administrative law judge to resolve any disputes on discovery, as provided for in WAC 480-09-480. In order to ensure the availability of the administrative law judge for resolution of any dispute, the parties will provide ample advance notice.

The Commission entered a protective order in this proceeding on April 9, 1992.
