This Is How I Feel Of The Rate Increases

with the Washington State Public Utility Commission, the electric and natural gas rates for each utility are set annually by the Commission. Avista is proposing electric, and natural gas rates to occur April 1, 2020, and April 1, 2021. Avista requests a request to approve, deny, or modify the requested rates. If approved, electric revenues would increase by:

- April 1, 2020: 8.8% or \$45.8 million
- April 1, 2021: 3.3% or \$18.9 million

If approved, natural gas revenues would increase by:

- April 1, 2020: 10.1% or \$12.9 million
- April 1, 2021: 4.6% or \$6.5 million
