BACKGROUND

1 This matter comes before the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) for approval of a negotiated second amended agreement (Amended Agreement) under the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (Telecom Act). The Amended Agreement is between Looking Glass Networks, Inc., (Looking Glass), and Qwest Corporation (Qwest). On December 11, 2000, the parties filed a joint request that Looking Glass receive all arrangements provided in an interconnection agreement previously approved by the Commission between Metromedia Fiber Network Services, Inc. (Metromedia), and Qwest in Docket UT-993010. The Commission accepted this request on December 27, 2000. On March 13, 2002, the Commission approved a first amended agreement. The Commission ordered that in the event the parties amended their agreement, the amended agreement would be deemed a new agreement under the Telecom Act and must be submitted to the Commission for approval. The parties filed a joint request for approval of a second amendment on October 28, 2002.

MEMORANDUM

2 The Amended Agreement between Looking Glass and Qwest was brought
before the Commission at its regularly scheduled open meeting held on
November 27, 2002, at its offices in Olympia, Washington. The Commission
granted its approval of the Agreement as negotiated and requested by the
parties.

FINDINGS OF FACT

3 The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with
the authority to regulate the rates, rules, regulations, practices, accounts,
securities, and transfers of public service companies, including
telecommunications companies.

4 Section 252(e)(1) of the Telecom Act requires parties to a negotiated agreement to
submit the agreement to the Commission for approval. Section 252(e)(2)(A)
states that the Commission may only reject an agreement (or any portion thereof)
adopted by negotiation if it finds that:

5 (i) the agreement (or any portion thereof) discriminates against a
telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement; or

6 (ii) the implementation of such agreement or portion is not consistent
with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

7 Qwest is engaged in the business of furnishing telecommunications services,
including, but not limited to, basic local exchange service within the state of
Washington.

8 Looking Glass is authorized to provide telecommunications services to the public in the state of Washington.

9 On December 11, 2000, the parties filed with the Commission a joint request that Looking Glass receive all arrangements provided in an interconnection agreement previously approved by the Commission between Metromedia and Qwest in Docket UT-993010. The Commission accepted this request on December 27, 2000. On March 13, 2002, the Commission approved a first amended agreement. The Commission ordered that in the event the parties amended their agreement, the amended agreement would be deemed a new agreement under the Telecom Act and must be submitted to the Commission for approval.

10 On October 28, 2002, the parties filed with the Commission a joint request for approval of a second amendment to the previously approved interconnection agreement pursuant to the Telecom Act.

11 Looking Glass and Qwest voluntarily negotiated the entire amendment.

12 The Amended Agreement does not discriminate against any other telecommunications carrier.

13 The Amended Agreement will facilitate local exchange competition in the state of Washington by enabling Looking Glass to enter the local exchange market and increase customer choices for local exchange services.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

14 The Commission has jurisdiction over the subject matter and all parties to this proceeding.

15 The Amended Agreement is consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.

16 The Amended Agreement meets the requirements of Sections 251 and 252 of the Telecom Act, including Section 252(e).

17 The laws and regulations of the State of Washington and Commission orders govern the construction and interpretation of the Amended Agreement. The Amended Agreement is subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

18 The Amended Agreement Looking Glass Networks, Inc., and Qwest Corporation, which the parties filed on October 28, 2002, is approved and effective as of the date of this order.

19 In the event that the parties revise, modify, or amend the agreement approved in this order, the revised, modified, or amended agreement will be deemed to be a new negotiated agreement under the Telecom Act and must be submitted to the Commission for approval, pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 252(e)(1) and relevant provisions of state law, prior to taking effect.

20 The laws and regulations of the State of Washington and Commission orders govern the construction and interpretation of the Amended Agreement. The Amended Agreement is subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission.
