- PROCEEDINGS: On July 12, 2004, the Washington Exchange Carrier Association (WECA) filed a Petition requesting the Commission to enter an order requiring WebTel Wireless, Inc. (WebTel), to register as a telecommunications company or to cease and desist doing business as a telecommunications company in Washington. WebTel did not exercise its option to file an answer by August 1, 2004, the deadline under WAC 480-07-370. The Commission conducted a prehearing conference before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss on August 13, 2004.
- PARTY REPRESENTATIVES: Richard A. Finnigan, attorney, Olympia, Washington, represents WECA. Henry K. Hamilton and Jeffrey M. Grieff, Grieff & Hamilton, PLLC, Seattle, Washington, represent WebTel. Jonathan Thompson, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff).<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In formal proceedings, such as this case, the Commission's regulatory staff functions as an independent party with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as any other party to the proceeding. There is an "ex parte wall" separating the Commissioners, the presiding ALJ, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors from all parties, including Staff. *RCW* 34.05.455.

- 3 **PETITIONS TO INTERVENE:** No one petitioned to intervene.
- DISCOVERY; PROTECTIVE ORDER: The Commission determines that this proceeding requires the opportunity for discovery in accordance with WAC 480-07-400. The parties may commence discovery using the methods described in and subject to the requirements of WAC 480-07-400 415.
- No one requested that a protective order be entered at this time. The parties may subsequently request a protective order by motion, should the need arise.
- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE: The Commission establishes the procedural schedule that is attached to this Order as Appendix 1, which is incorporated into the body of this Order by this reference. All dates are for service by electronic means. The original and required copies must be delivered to the Commission by the following business day for official filing.
- FILING; COPIES OF MATERIALS: Parties must file with the Commission an original plus 13 copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials to meet the Commission's requirements for official filing and internal distribution. Paper copies of these materials are required to conform to the format and publication guidelines set forth in WAC 480-07-395 and 480-07-460, and must be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed to the Commission Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250, or delivered by hand to the Commission Executive Secretary at the Commission's records center at the

indicated street address. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by U.S. Postal Service.

- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@wutc.wa.gov</u>>, or by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette including the filed document(s). The Commission prefers that parties furnish electronic copies in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format, supplemented by a separate file in MS Word 6.0 (or later), or WordPerfect 5.1 (or later) format. Parties are required to organize and identify electronic files as specified in WAC 480-07-140(5).
- NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the date of mailing of this statement, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this prehearing conference order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
