Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The proposed rules would implement statutory changes in RCW 80.80.010, RCW 80.80.040 and RCW 80.80.060 enacted in the state of Washington's 2009 regular legislative session. On April 20, 2009, and May 11, 2009, respectively, the Governor signed Senate Bill 5989, Chapter 147, Laws of 2009 and House Bill 2129, Chapter 448, Laws of 2009 with the common title "Greenhouse Gas Emissions Performance Standard." The proposed rules revise standards and/or procedures under which electric utilities, either inside or outside of a general rate case, will seek a determination by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission that their long-term financial commitments comply with the greenhouse gas emissions performance standards found in RCW 80.80.005, et seq. The proposed rules also revise standards and/or procedures under which electric utilities that do not meet the greenhouse gas emissions performance standards may request exemption from the standards from the Commission. Finally, the proposed rules include certain renewable resources, the cost for which electric utilities are allowed to defer for later Commission consideration.
