Dear Sir or Madam:

As you are aware, on July 23, 2012, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission issued a Penalty Assessment against Always Able Moving Service, LLC in the amount of \$2,100 for violation of WAC 480-15-480, which requires household goods carriers to file an annual report with the Commission by May 1 each year. The Commission sent Always Able Moving Service, LLC a Second Notice on August 29, 2012, and a Final Notice on October 3, 2012. On October 26, 2012, in response to a request for mitigation, the Commission entered Order 01: Order Mitigating and Partially Suspending Penalty, Subject to Condition, mitigating the penalty to \$1,050, and suspending that amount by \$800, leaving \$250 due and owing. The Commission sent Always Able Moving Service, LLC Corrected Final Notices on November 14, 2012, and February 12, 2013.

The Commission did not receive the \$250 payment is due and owing.

This is to notify you that the Commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$250 balance.
