PROCEEDINGS

JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be on the record.

Good morning. This is Docket TN-170131, which is captioned In the Matter of the Investigation of Stillaguamish Senior Center for Compliance with WAC 480-31-130.

My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm the administrative law judge presiding over today's brief adjudicative proceeding. Today is Monday, May 15th, 2017, and it's just a little after 9:30 a.m.

On March 31st, 2017, the Commission issued a Notice of Intent to Cancel Certificate, Notice of Brief Adjudicative Proceeding, Setting Time for Oral Statements. The Commission issued the Notice of Intent to Cancel following a compliance review conducted by Commission Staff in March 2017, which resulted in a proposed unsatisfactory safety rating for Stillaguamish Senior Center.

The Company was required to file a proposed
Safety Management Plan, which we had a brief discussion
before coming on the record about the Safety Management

1	Plan. Staff is still waiting for one final component
2	before it can make a recommendation about upgrading the
3	Company's safety rating.
4	So after we proceed with the preliminaries
5	and Staff's first witness, we will take a recess to
6	attempt to verify whether those final records have been
7	received before we proceed to Staff's recommendation.
8	So I also want to address the penalty
9	assessment in Docket TN-170130 in the amount of \$3,600.
10	And Ms. Klemens, you filed an application for mitigation
11	on April 20th and requested a hearing.
12	MS. KLEMENS: Correct.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: So I'm assuming that neither
14	party has an objection to consolidating these two
15	dockets so we can address all of the issues here today?
16	MR. O'CONNELL: Not from Staff, your Honor.
17	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Then I will
18	consolidate Dockets TN-170131 and TN-170130, and we can
19	hear from the parties on both of those dockets this
20	morning. So when I call on you to testify, I'll swear
21	you in with the oath of witness, so anything that you
22	tell us today will be under oath and will be considered
23	sworn testimony.
24	And for the court reporter's benefit, please
25	speak slowly and clearly and be sure to use the

1	microphone on the table. And once you're sworn in, you
2	can present your testimony and introduce any exhibits
3	you pre-filed which I don't believe that the Company
4	has, just Staff and I'll rule on the admissibility of
5	each of those.
6	So we'll start by having Staff address the
7	proposed Safety Management Plan and safety rating.
8	Specifically, like I said earlier, we'll address the
9	compliance review and then we'll get to Staff's
10	recommendation following the recess.
11	Following Staff's first witness,
12	Ms. Klemens, you can ask her any questions if you have
13	any, and then at that time we'll hear from you about the
14	violations and the penalty assessment.
15	Once you're done testifying, Mr. O'Connell
16	may have some questions for you, then we'll take a
17	recess and Mr. Perkinson can verify whether he's
18	received those additional records.
19	Do you have any questions before we get
20	started?
21	MS. KLEMENS: No.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So let's take an
23	appearance just a brief appearance from Commission
24	Staff.
25	Mr. O'Connell?

1	MR. O'CONNELL: Thank you, your Honor.
2	Andrew J. O'Connell, Assistant Attorney General,
3	representing Commission Staff. Seated to my right is
4	Ms. Sandi Yeomans, S-A-N-D-I Y-E-O-M-A-N-S. And next to
5	her is Mr. Mathew Perkinson, M-A-T-H-E-W
6	P-E-R-K-I-N-S-O-N.
7	Ms. Yeomans will be testifying about her
8	compliance review of the Company and the violations that
9	she discovered, and Mr. Perkinson will be available to
10	discuss his evaluation of the Safety Management Plan
11	submitted by the Company as well as Staff's
12	recommendation for mitigation of the penalty assessment.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
14	Ms. Klemens, if you could state your full
15	name and spell your last name for the record.
16	MS. KLEMENS: It is Danette Marie Klemens,
17	and it's D-A-N-E-T-T-E, Marie, K-L-E-M-E-N-S.
18	JUDGE PEARSON: Is your microphone on?
19	MS. KLEMENS: I believe so. I'll just sit
20	closer.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: And can you give us your
22	address and phone number and email address?
23	MS. KLEMENS: Address is 7810 87th Avenue
24	NE, Marysville, Washington, phone number is
25	(425) 823-0458.

1	JUDGE PEARSON: Do you have an email
2	address?
3	MS. KLEMENS: Yes. D, like in David,
4	k-l-e-m-e-n-s, @stilly, s-t-i-l-l-y, center.org.
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
6	So Mr. O'Connell, you may proceed with your
7	first witness when you're ready.
8	MR. O'CONNELL: Staff would call Ms. Sandi
9	Yeomans, your Honor.
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Ms. Yeomans, please
11	stand and raise your right hand.
12	(Witness sworn.)
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. You may be seated.
14	MR. O'CONNELL: And your Honor, before we
15	get started, I have a packet of exhibits to give to you.
16	These exhibits have already been given to Ms. Klemens.
17	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
18	MR. O'CONNELL: So there are actually four
19	copies of each exhibit in the packet I gave you due to
20	the two docket numbers, so I apologize for any
21	confusion. And there should only be one set that you
22	would need to review. They're all the same.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Ms. Klemens, do you
24	have any objection to admitting these exhibits into the
25	record?

1	MS. KLEMENS: I do not at this time.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So we'll just go
3	ahead and admit Exhibits SY-1, SY-2, and MP-1, MP-2 and
4	MP-3 into the record.
5	(Exhibit Nos. SY-1, SY-2, MP-1,
6	MP-2 & MP-3 were admitted.)
7	MR. O'CONNELL: And I would note,
8	your Honor, that MP-3 is a copy of Staff's evaluation of
9	the Safety Management Plan. That document Staff had to
10	prepare after the time in which the exhibit list was due
11	in this docket, so that exhibit did not appear on the
12	original exhibit list.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: That's okay. Thank you for
14	bringing that to my attention.
15	You may proceed.
16	MR. O'CONNELL: Okay.
17	
18	SANDI YEOMANS, witness herein, having been.
19	first duly sworn on oath,
20	was examined and testified
21	as follows:

25	Q. Would you please state your name and spell it

5	A.	I'm a special investigator.
6	Q.	Who is your employer?
7	A.	Utilities and Transportation Commission.
8	Q.	How long have you worked for the Commission?
9	A.	Almost two years.
10	Q.	And what are your duties as a special
11	investigator?	
12	A.	My duties are to meet with companies and go
13	throu	ugh their paperwork and their vehicles to assure
14	that they meet the regulations and laws for the state of	
15	Wasl	hington.
16	Q.	Did you conduct a compliance review of
17	Stilla	guamish Senior Center's operation?
18	A.	Yes, I did.
19	Q.	When did you do that?
20	A.	I first met with them on January 31st, 2017.
21	Q.	And I'd like to direct your attention to the
22	Exhib	oit No. SY-1. Would you please identify that
23	exhib	oit?
24	A.	This is a summary of the compliance review for
25	Stilla	guamish Senior Center.

1	Q.	And during your investigation, did you find any	
2	violations?		
3	A.	Yes, I did.	
4	Q.	Were any of the violations critical violations?	
5	A.	Yes.	
6	Q.	What were those?	
7	A.	Use of driver not medically examined and	
8	certif	fied, failing to maintain driver qualification	
9	files,	failing to require a record of duty status, and	
10	failin	g to complete DVIRs.	
11	Q.	Are those critical violations documented in your	
12	assig	nment report?	
13	A.	Yes, they are.	
14	Q.	Were there other violations that were not	
15	critica	al that are documented in your assignment report?	
16	A.	Yes.	
17	Q.	Okay.	
18	,	So I want to ask about the critical violations	
19	and their significance. Why is it important that all		
20	drive	rs be medically examined and certified?	
21	A.	This is to ensure that drivers are physically	
22	fit to	drive a commercial motor vehicle.	
23	Q.	And why is it important that the Company	
24	main	tain driver qualification files?	
25	A.	That is to make sure that the drivers meet	

1	miniı	mum qualifications to be a safe driver.
2	Q.	And why is it important that you strive or
3	make	e a record of duty status?
4	A.	Stillaguamish is a short-haul under a
5	shor	t-haul exemption, so you have to make sure that
6	their	drivers are not going over hours so that they
7	aren'	't fatigued.
8	Q.	Okay.
9		And what are DVIRs and why are they important
10	for dr	rivers to complete?
11	A.	DVIRs are Driver Vehicle Inspection Reports.
12	They	're done at the end of a shift to make sure that the
13	vehicle is free of defects before it's dispatched the	
14	next	day.
15	Q.	Did you meet with the Company to explain these
16	critica	al violations?
17	A.	Yes, I did.
18	Q.	And did you inform them of their unsatisfactory
19	safet	y rating?
20	A.	Yes, I did.
21	Q.	Did you tell the Company what they need to do in
22	order	to get an upgrade to that safety rating?
23	A.	Yes, I did.
24	Q.	Did you provide documentation to the Company?
25	Δ	Yes

1	Q.	Is Exhibit SY-2, are those documents the
2	docu	ments you gave to the Company?
3	A.	Yes.
4	Q.	Can you please explain how this safety rating
5	was o	determined from those critical violations?
6	A.	Yeah. In the exhibit, the one that is stated
7	Safet	y Fitness Rating Explanation, page 1 of 2 I'm
8	not s	ure which one it is in the pack oh, page 16
9	there	are six different factors which determine the
10	rating	g of a company.
11		In regards to Stillaguamish, they had critical
12	violations in three categories, and that put them into	
13	the u	nsatisfactory status.
14	Q.	Now, is the formula to calculate this safety
15	fitnes	s rating, is that included in this documentation?
16	A.	Yes.
17	Q.	Is that on page 17?
18	A.	Yes.
19	Q.	Okay.
20		Now, throughout your investigation, were the
21	Com	pany and the people that you interacted with
22	coop	erative?
23	A.	Very much so.
24	Q.	Did they offer any explanation of why these
25	violat	ions may have occurred?

1	A.	Yes. They had previous staff was retired and
2	faile	d to do training with the new staff before they
3	left.	
4	Q.	Has this company had any violations before?
5	A.	Yes.
6	Q.	When were those violations?
7	A.	In their last review in 2007, they did have a
8	viola	tion for drivers not having medical examination and
9	certi	fication.
10	Q.	Is that the same as the violation you discovered
11	in this	s case?
12	A.	Yes.
13		MR. O'CONNELL: I don't have any further
14	ques	tions for Ms. Yeomans, your Honor.
15		JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
16		Ms. Klemens, do you have any questions for
17	Ms. Y	eomans?
18		MS. KLEMENS: No questions.
19		JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So at this point what
20	l'd lik	e to do is swear you in, Ms. Klemens, and then we
21	can v	valk through the violations, and I'll give you an
22	oppo	rtunity to explain how they occurred and what steps
23	you'v	e taken, and then talk about the penalty amount and
24	why y	you believe it should be mitigated and what you
25	think	a fair amount would be.

DIRECT TESTIMONY BY MS. KLEMENS 15

1	MS. KLEMENS: Thank you.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: So if you could just stand
3	and raise your right hand.
4	
5	DANETTE KLEMENS, witness herein, having been
6	first duly sworn on oath,
7	was examined and testified
8	as follows:
9	
LO	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. You may be seated.
L1	So let's just go through the violations one at a time.
L2	The first one is 49 CFR Part 391.45(a), failing to
L3	require employees to be medically examined and certified
L4	prior to driving Company vehicles on 33 occasions. This
L5	comprises of the \$3,300 portion of the penalty for 33
L6	violations.
L7	MS. KLEMENS: And I'm sorry. Would you like
L8	me to just respond to that at this time?
L9	JUDGE PEARSON: If you just want to explain
20	how they occurred, and then what you've done to correct
21	them and make sure that it doesn't happen again.
22	
23	DIRECT TESTIMONY BY MS. KLEMENS
24	MS. KLEMENS: Correct. As was stated

already, I have taken over as the director officially

DIRECT TESTIMONY BY MS. KLEMENS

January 3rd of this year. And my predecessor, for whatever reason, this area was not overseen as it should have been and complied with.

And what we have done is ensure that we have files and records maintained on all drivers at this time. And no driver will begin driving any of our vehicles until they have had the DOT physical and that has been signed off and certified by a physician.

And then we have a file on each driver with all following forms that are in the UTC handbook that we have, and then we are also following up with reminders through Outlook calendars to remind us of when these will come up annually to make sure that we maintain those to be current.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. The second violation was 49 CFR Part 391.51(a), failing to maintain driver qualification files for each employee, and this was \$100 for five violations.

MS. KLEMENS: And we now have files on each driver that drives with all the relative forms to keep them accurate and current as drivers. And those, again, will be monitored on a regular basis through Outlook calendars with our program coordinator who oversees this area of our function in the operation.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

DIRECT TESTIMONY BY MS. KLEMENS

The third violation was 49 CFR Part
395.8(a), failing to require drivers to make a record of
duty status. This was \$100 for 13 violations.

MS. KLEMENS: All right. If I'm reading
this correctly, this is -- this has been incorporated
into our driver pretrip sheet so that all duty hours are

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JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. My pen stopped working when you were about halfway through that, so you said this has been incorporated into the driver pretrip sheet?

recorded before and after each trip, and these records

will be maintained for each trip in the future.

MS. KLEMENS: Correct, so that all duty hours are recorded before and after every trip, and these records are maintained for each trip in the future.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

And then finally is 49 CFR Part 396.11(a), failing to require drivers to prepare driver vehicle inspection reports. This was \$100 penalty for 16 violations.

MS. KLEMENS: And so our current form has been modified to include all requirements necessary for this form. And this form listing the defect has been corrected and is now used by all drivers and will be

2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
3	And then is there anything that you want to
4	add about the amount of the penalty?
5	MS. KLEMENS: I would ask if whatever
6	possible can be done to mitigate this. It's an
7	unforeseen expense in our budget. As with most senior
8	centers, we run extremely tight and are very limited on
9	our budget funds.
10	Just as a side item, as many senior centers
11	in Snohomish County last year, we lost critical funding
12	from United Way in the amount of \$30,000. So that has
13	added an additional burden to our budget this year.
14	So I would just ask for whatever
15	consideration would be possible to mitigate these
16	penalties, because it will impact the rest of our
17	operation that affects the seniors.
18	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
19	Mr. O'Connell, do you have any questions for
20	Ms. Klemens?
21	MR. O'CONNELL: Only one.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
23	CROSS-EXAMINATION

6	Q.	Would you please state your name and spell it
7	for th	e record?
8	A.	It's Mathew Perkinson, M-A-T-H-E-W
9	P-E-I	R-K-I-N-S-O-N.
10	Q.	And what is your occupation?
11	A.	Motor carrier safety supervisor.
12	Q.	And who is your employer?
13	A.	Washington Utilities and Transportation
14	Com	mission.
15	Q.	How long have you been employed by the
16	Com	mission?
17	A.	About five years.
18	Q.	And what are your responsibilities in your
19	curre	nt role as the motor carrier safety supervisor?
20	A.	Currently I oversee a team of five investigators
21	who	perform compliance investigations.
22	Q.	Would that include Ms. Sandi Yeomans?
23	A.	Yes.
24	Q.	Are you familiar with the company Stillaguamish
25	Senio	or Center?

1	A.	Yes, I am.
2	Q.	How were you involved in this matter concerning
3	Stilla	guamish Senior Center?
4	A.	I reviewed the report that Ms. Yeomans
5	subn	nitted.
6	Q.	Okay.
7		And you're aware that Ms. Yeomans found
8	violat	ions through her investigation?
9	A.	Yes.
10	Q.	And are you familiar with the penalty assessment
11	relate	ed to those violations?
12	A.	Yes, I am.
13	Q.	And are you aware that the Company has asked for
14	mitig	ation?
15	A.	Yes.
16	Q.	So and is Exhibit MP-1 a copy of that
17	appli	cation for mitigation?
18	A.	Yes, it is.
19	Q.	Are you also aware that the Company received an
20	unsa	tisfactory safety rating?
21	A.	Yes.
22	Q.	Did the Company submit a Safety Management Plan
23	in ord	der to get an upgrade to its safety rating?
24	A.	Yes.

Q. I'd like to direct your attention to Exhibit

- MP-2. Is that a true and accurate copy of the Safety
- 2 | Management Plan that the Company submitted?
- 3 A. Yes, it is.
- 4 Q. Okay.
 - What is your role in this process?
- 6 A. Working with Ms. Yeomans, I will evaluate the
- Safety Management Plan to determine whether or not the
- 8 Company addressed each violation, identify why the
- 9 violations were allowed to occur, and then determine if
- 10 the actions that they've taken are appropriate to
- prevent future violations from occurring, and then
- 12 reviewing any supporting documents to that plan.
- Q. So you heard Ms. Klemens' testimony a little bit
- earlier. Is her account of what the Company has done to
- remedy the violations supported by the Company's Safety
- 16 | Management Plan?
- 17 **A.** Yes, it is.
- 18 Q. Do you think the Company's Safety Management
- 19 | Plan is acceptable?
- 20 **A. Yes, I do.**
- Q. Have they met the requirements to get an
- 22 upgrade?
- 23 A. Yes.
- Q. Would you please explain how you evaluated the
- 25 | plan and your recommendation?

A. Sure. So the plan, as you can see in MP
Exhibit MP-2, identifies each violation as it's recorded
in Ms. Yeomans' report, and then provides supporting
documentation to respond to those.

The plan also identifies specific individuals as having responsibilities going forward to help prevent that. And it also includes an explanation of tools used, such as Outlook calendar reminders, that will again prevent similar violations from happening again we hope.

- Q. Has Staff accepted such remedies as acceptable in the past?
- A. Yes, they have.
- 14 | Q. Okay.

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- Please continue.
 - A. So in summary -- would you like me to go forward with the recommendation?
- 18 Q. Yes, please.
 - A. Okay. So Staff has reviewed the plan and, like I said, it does address each violation. It identifies how the violations occurred. It describes corrective action taken by the Company to prevent future violations. In addition to that, medical certificates, forms such as hours of service and daily vehicle inspection reports and driver qualification files, have

1	been	reviewed and those are in compliance.
2	I	Based on that information, Staff would recommend
3	upgra	iding the rating from unsatisfactory to conditional
4	effect	ive today, May 15, 2017.
5	Q.	Now, did you write your recommendation in a
6	memo	o?
7	A.	Yes.
8	Q.	And is that memo Exhibit No. MP-3?
9	A.	Yes.
LO	Q.	So does this memo contain the evaluation and the
L1	recon	nmendation that you just made?
L2	A.	Yes, it does.
L3	Q.	So I'd like to turn to the Company's penalty
L4	asses	ssment and their request for mitigation of that
L5	penal	ty assessment. And from your involvement in this
L6	case,	you're aware that Stillaguamish Senior Center was
L7	asses	ssed a penalty of \$3,600, correct?
L8	A.	Yes.
L9	Q.	Does Staff have a recommendation for mitigation?
20	A.	Yes.
21	Q.	What is that recommendation?
22	A.	So the Company's taken steps to bring its
23	opera	ations into compliance, and we appreciate that,
24	Ms. K	(lemens. The medical certificate violations are, as

Ms. Yeomans noted, repeat violation from a 2007

1	compliance investigation.
2	And for that reason, Staff does not recommend
3	reducing the \$3,600 penalty, but is willing to suspend
4	\$2,600 of the \$3,600 penalty for a period of one year
5	with condition.
6	Q. So with Staff's recommendation, how much in
7	penalty amount does that mean the Company would have
8	payable now?
9	A. It would be \$1,000.
10	Q. And is part of the reason Staff believes
11	mitigation is acceptable here is that because of the
12	Company's cooperation with Staff and willingness to move
13	forward and being compliant with the rules?
14	A. Yes, all those reasons, and to help ensure
15	future compliance.
16	Q. Is there anything else that you'd like to add to
17	your testimony?
18	A. I would just like to thank Ms. Klemens again for
19	coming down today and working and being very cooperative
20	with Ms. Yeomans. We appreciate that, and we hope that
21	you guys stay out of our hair in the future and we don't
22	have any compliance issues. So thank you. Looks like
23	you're heading in that direction.

MR. O'CONNELL: I have no more questions.

JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.

24

1	Ms. Klemens, do you have any questions for
2	Mr. Perkinson?
3	MS. KLEMENS: I don't have any at this time.
4	Thank you.
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So I will probably
6	issue an order probably Wednesday due to the fact
7	that we will all be off site at a training tomorrow.
8	However, I will, right now, issue an oral
9	ruling from the bench upgrading the Company's safety
10	rating to conditional so that there's no need to worry
11	about anything happening at midnight tonight. So that
12	part's taken care of.
13	The order will reflect my decision on the
14	penalty amount. And is Staff open to a payment
15	arrangement if the Company needs one?
16	MR. PERKINSON: Yes.
17	JUDGE PEARSON: All right. So I will take
18	that in mind. And is there anything else before we go
19	off the record today?
20	MR. O'CONNELL: I do think I need to clarify
21	one part of Staff's penalty assessment mitigation
22	recommendation.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
