In the Matter of a Penalty Assessment Against 3Z Movers LLC in the amount of \$15,200	DOCKET TV-180198 ORDER 02 ORDER GRANTING PAYMENT ARRANGEMENT
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BACKGROUND

- 1 On March 20, 2018, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) assessed a \$15,200 penalty (Penalty Assessment) against 3Z Movers LLC (3Z Movers or Company) for 165 critical violations of Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-15-550; WAC 480-15-555; and WAC 480-15-560 through 570, which adopt by reference sections of Title 49 Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.).
- 2 On April 17, 2018, the Company responded to the Penalty Assessment, admitting the violations and requesting mitigation of the penalty based on the written information provided.
- 3 On May 10, 2018, the Commission entered Order 01, Granting Mitigation to \$8,000 (Order 01). Order 01 suspended \$4,000 of the penalty for a period of two years, subject to the following conditions: (1) 3Z Movers must either pay the \$4,000 portion of the penalty that is not suspended or file jointly with Staff a proposed payment arrangement within 10 days of the effective date of the Order; and (2) 3Z Movers may not incur any repeat violations of critical regulations.
- 4 On June 4, 2018, Staff contacted the Executive Director and Secretary of the Commission explaining that the Company requested to pay the penalty in twenty monthly installments, and that Staff supports the request. The Company and Staff jointly propose the following payment schedule:

5 Staff also proposes that if 3Z Movers misses one payment, the entire balance will become due and payable immediately.

DISCUSSION

6 The installment payment schedule Staff and the Company propose is reasonable. The Commission approves the proposal with one modification. 3Z Movers may make additional payments in advance of the payment due dates or pay an increased amount on the due dates, but no additional payment or increased amount will relieve the Company of its obligation to make timely monthly installments of \$200 until the full amount of \$4,000 is satisfied.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 7 (1) The \$4,000 penalty is due and payable to the Commission in installments as set out in paragraph 4, above.
- 8 (2) If 3Z Movers LLC fails to pay any installment by 5 p.m. on the date it is due, the unpaid balance, as well as the \$4,000 suspended portion of the penalty, will immediately become due and payable without further order by the Commission.

- 9 (3) 3Z Movers LLC may make additional payments in advance of the payment due dates or pay an increased amount on the due dates, but no additional payment or increased amount will relieve the Company of its obligation to make timely monthly installments until the full amount is satisfied.
- 10 The Secretary has been delegated authority to enter this order on behalf of the Commissioners under WAC 480-07-904(1)(h).
