It is the Commission Staff's position that if the letter does not come back, it is deemed to be served. So whether it was either forwarded or if the person at that address destroyed it, I'm unaware. It just did not come back to us. So I felt that was a good mailing address.

When doing the Order 01, everything with the process server, sometimes Secretary of State's addresses we also check, but also too for personal addresses may not be the same as what's registered with the Secretary of State. In using the tools that Staff has available to them, I found a newer address in Everett. An address. I don't know.
